## COMMITTEE OPERATIONS

At the 2016 AGM:

- Attendance numbers at the AGM were again low, with the required quorum only just being met. Finding sufficient members with the time and inclination to stand for the Committee is an ongoing issue, and vacancies remain. This makes it doubly difficult to institute some form of succession planning for the key Committee positions, as the appropriate candidates are not coming forward.
- There were a few changes to the Committee. After many years on the Committee as the Junior Cricket Convenor, Henk Stoffers stood down, with Paul Cottam taking over his role. Henk's great service to the Club was warmly acknowledged at the AGM. Paul now convenes an active Junior Committee that has managed junior cricket matters within the club very well. On the administration side, he is very ably assisted by Nicola Smith and Kristi Daly.
- Also standing down was Club Captain Matt Richens who, in addition to his Club Captain's role, had tried gallantly to promote the wider use of social media to improve communications with our younger player base – with some success. Roger Savage also resigned, while Tom Dixon was the only new addition..

At the first committee meeting Nev Lyons was appointed to the committee, filling one of the vacancies.

Howard Morel was elected Chairperson but was only briefly involved in Club affairs this season as he resigned in November. Donn Leckie, Vice President, took over as Chairperson. The President's position remained vacant.

Four subcommittees operated throughout the season. Their responsibilities are given below, with convenors as noted.

- **Activities Subcommittee** (social and cricket events, publicity and promotion; communications: convenor – *Mike Johnston*)
- **Business Subcommittee** (finance, sponsorship & fund raising, subscriptions, planning & club management, membership, club records, liaison with SSCL board: convenor – *Jeff Cope*)
- **Cricket Subcommittee** (training & coaching, player recruitment, team entries, grounds & practice facilities, gear, school liaison, awards, disciplinary; convenors – *Donn Leckie / Steve Graham*)
- **Junior Subcommittee** (managing the operations of the Junior cricket section; convenor – *Paul Cottam*)

## **VICE PRESIDENTS ÓVERVIEW**

From an overall perspective, the 2016-17 season was another reasonably successful one for the club.

The Premier team struggled somewhat throughout, hindered in part by the lack of availability of our three Canterbury representative players Tim Johnston, Leo Carter and Kenny McClure for a large part of the season. It's wonderful to have club members selected for higher honours but it does place pressure on our diminished player resources.

Strike bowler Nathan McNicol spent time out injured, as well as a stint with Canterbury A. He made up for it on his return, playing in 2A for a time, where he notched up a couple of quick-fire centuries batting in his inimitable ebullient style.

2A were required to take what was left of the player stocks and performed remarkably well, making the one-day and T20 semi-finals, and finishing at the upper end of the two-day competition, using a total of 37 players along the way. They were well organised by Gareth Sanders who was brought in to manage the team and to improve the team's standing, given the disappointing results of the previous couple of years.

The afternoon grades continue to be where the club seems to notch most of its successes and this season we did very well. Winning teams came through in Presidents Grade, 3B, 3C, and the T20. We also provided up to three players in the zonal LP-ES combined team that won the Premier Women's competition, taking out the one-day and T20 titles.

These pleasing results across the grades resulted in the club coming second (by a narrow margin) in the Petersen Shield, which is awarded to the Premier Club with the best performance across all CMCA grades.

On another issue, the club was rocked at the beginning of the season with the sudden resignation of President Howard Morel. As was well documented in the news media at the time, he was reportedly involved in some financial irregularities as Treasurer of the Shirley Rugby Football Club. It is important to note that he was not involved in the financial management of our club, and similar irregularities are most unlikely to occur due to the stringent (and transparent) financial processes we have in place. He did, however, have a role in initiating grant funding applications, and his sudden departure put this process behind schedule which subsequently placed our cash-flow under some pressure. This process was back on track by mid-season. It has, however, contributed to the somewhat tightened financial position we are now in, as set out in the Treasurer's Report.

The committee decided not to replace Howard as President, instead sharing the presidential duties out across Jeff Cope, John Grocott, Harry Burson and Donn Leckie until the next AGM.

## **COACHING AND SELECTION**

### **Men's Grades**

#### **Selectors**

There were a number of changes to the Premier/2A playing squad for the 2016-17 season. The major change was the retirement of Neville Lyons as Premier coach, a position he had held for 13 years. Stepping in the shoes of such a highly respected and successful club coach was a little bit daunting but it was also exciting to be able to continue the fine work that Neville has carried out at the Club.

Before the season started a significant amount of time and effort was put into some off season 'recruiting' by our hard working committee and some senior players. This resulted in a number of new players joining the squad. Blake Coburn re-joined his old school mates at the club; Gareth Sanders bravely took over the 2<sup>nd</sup> grade captaincy; three English players Harry Jackman, Matt Jennings and Tommy Wheeler were gained; and later in the season Chris Duggan, Harrison Richards, and Ben McKibben were gladly welcomed to the squad.

One of the main aims for the 2016/17 season was to have our 2<sup>nd</sup> grade side playing every Saturday after the struggles experienced last season. This proved very difficult at times especially later in the season when we had several premier players away for representative duties or unavailable for various reasons. However, we did manage to get a team 'on the park' every Saturday even if that team was weaker than ideal on occasions. This continues to be a 'work on' for the coming season.

Congratulations once again to our Canterbury 'First Class' Representatives Tim Johnston, Ken McClure, and Leo Carter (although recovering from shoulder surgery for most of the season). Nathan McNichol was also selected for first class honours but did not make the final playing side. His chance will no doubt come next season. Congratulations also to Tim Hampton-Matehe, Blake Coburn and Nathan McNichol who were selected for the Canterbury 'A' tour to Australia. It is great to see these players being recognised for their achievements. It is a testament to the 'good character' of these players that they always play for East Shirley when available and attend club practices whenever possible. The other squad members really appreciate the commitment these guys show to the squad and the club overall.

It was really a season of two parts for the Premier Team with the team performing very well in the One Day and T20 competitions but disappointingly in the Two Day competition. The highlight of the season was undoubtedly finishing top qualifier for the one day semi-finals. Unfortunately, we lost this game, performing slightly below par on the day. With the great form and confidence that we had leading into this game we should have won this game and been in the final. However, we had a slightly off-day and got a bit rattled under pressure and despite fighting hard eventually lost this game. It was pleasing to see the development of a number of our younger players in this format of the game and, looking forward, we have the talent to be a dominant force in one-day cricket in the coming season(s).

In the T20 competition we carried on our good one day form and we qualified for the semi-finals by finishing second in our section. Again we had high expectations of winning the semi-final which was surprisingly played on a Thursday evening. But it was 'not to be'. We started poorly, never settled into our game and were well beaten. Again with the exciting talent we have at the club there is no reason why East Shirley can't win this title in the near future.

Our performances in the Two Day competition were disappointing and a significant improvement will be needed for the coming season. Despite the talent we had available early season we lost our first game and battled for a draw in the next game. We also failed to beat a weak but determined Marist side just before Christmas. Looking forward to next season we need to be a mentally tougher team to improve our performances in Two Day cricket. This will require greater consistency, better game awareness and decision making by the players. This will be a focus for the coming season.

A 'big thank you' to Nick Johnston who has captained the Premier side over the last seasons and who has now stepped down as captain. Nick has been an excellent captain and has been enjoyable to work with in developing the team. While Nick is disappointed he did not win any silverware he can be proud of his achievements in leading this team.

The 2<sup>nd</sup> grade team's season would also have to be rated an overall success. They made the 50 over one day semi-finals, lost their T20 final (although they were in a weaker grade for the T20, based on where they finished the previous season), finished 4<sup>th</sup> in the Two Day competition, and finished mid-table in a new type of 'one innings' cricket. I would like to acknowledge the contribution of Gareth Sanders who put his hand up to captain this side and who brought a maturity and competitiveness to the team. I also want to acknowledge the patience and perseverance of the regular 2<sup>nd</sup> grade players who have to put up with continual disruption/changes to their side and occasionally field players who are not up to standard. Hopefully, in the coming season the squad will be more settled and some silverware can be won.

I would like to finish by making some thank-yous and acknowledgements to people in the club for their efforts in the 2016/17 season.

- The premier squad players – for your ongoing commitment to developing your game and to the club. 'Big ups' for your efforts over the past season.
- Ryan Burson – who made a significant contribution as an 'assistant' coach and helped me make the transition into club coach. The boys in the team enjoy his positive attitude and humour.
- Jared Larsen ('statsman') – the Premier team scorer, statistician and best scorer in Canterbury. We are very lucky to have Jared doing this thankless yet important role.
- Pete Dunell - for the great pitches he prepares for both games and practices. This is a big factor in developing our players to a higher level.
- Donn Leckie and other committee members - for their help with selection and organisation of the teams.
- Harry Burson – for doing all those little jobs for the teams behind the scenes that often go unnoticed such as organising drinks and lunches.

- Neville Lyons – for his on-going advice and also for his help in organising a number of pre and early season matters.
- The committee – for their hard work in providing cricket for our club members and providing the opportunity for the Premier/2<sup>nd</sup> grade players to play, enjoy and develop their game.

Finally, I have really enjoyed being actively involved with the club once again this season and am looking forward to working with everyone again next season.

## **TREASURER'S REPORT**

The Club has had a difficult financial year. Due to unexpected circumstances, we did not receive any grant funding until late in the season and with higher operating costs for our coaching in particular, we have incurred a substantial loss of \$25,764 compared to a surplus of \$1,239 last year. The accounts are subject to audit at the time of writing.

Income is similar to 2016 with subs and fundraising showing increases and donations reducing. The increase in subs is partly due to additional teams. In particular, good efforts were made with fundraising from raffles. Details are shown in note 8. Thanks to the Junior committee for their efforts and the club for their support of these activities. We need to do a lot more. Unspent grants at balance date total \$4,949 (2016: \$5,000). Sundry income includes fees for coaching programmes led by Tasmeen Granger – our visiting coach.

Expenditure is well up on 2016 Coaching, gear, pavilion, uniforms and coaching travel are all up. Some of the increases are due to additional teams. Higher coaching costs were due to contract increases not incurred last year. Unfortunately, due to the late filing of grant applications, some of these costs were not able to be covered by external funding arrangements (assuming the grant applications had been successful).

The cost of gear, including cricket balls, is up due to additional teams and grounds are similar to 2016. Other costs are generally consistent with the previous year although there are some variations. Pavilion running costs are set by the directors of Shirley Sports Club Ltd based on funds required to manage the clubrooms effectively, following consultation with shareholders. Uniform costs are also up due to additional teams. Depreciation is the annual reduction in book value of our assets. This is a non-cash expense.

The statement of financial position clearly sets out the situation at balance date. With the large loss, the liquidity position has weakened with funds in the bank account considerably less than current liabilities. GST is a recovery, received since balance date, and inventories are down on last year. The special funds are on term deposit with Westpac and earn a small amount of interest. Details are shown in the notes.

Overall, our financial position has deteriorated in the 2017 year and considerable fundraising efforts will be needed to recover the situation. Our equity has reduced and we need to generate more income to both cover costs and recover equity. A surplus position is essential to maintain equity and cash flow. Losses are not sustainable in the long run so it is important to monitor incoming revenue closely and maintain good controls on expenditure.. This is something the incoming committee will need to address. Being a little on the back foot at the start due to our liquidity situation, the 2018 season will definitely be challenging..

The unaudited accounts of Shirley Sports Club Ltd are also included in the Annual Report. These show a loss after depreciation and reflect the matters regarding rents for member clubs mentioned above.

In conclusion, our thanks to the gaming trusts and Christchurch Metropolitan Cricket Assn. for their support as set out in the notes. Also, special thanks to Andy Innes of Cricket



Express, Allan Stroud of O'Sheas and all others for their continued support and sponsorship. These are acknowledged in more detail elsewhere in the report.

My thanks also to club members for their assistance during the year, particularly Harry Burson, Donn Leckie, Steve Graham, Paul Cottam and the Junior committee for the work they do collecting subs, handling hospitality activities, the raffle fundraisers and helping with other matters. A good effort by all concerned and much appreciated.

**NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS****FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MAY 2017****1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES****Reporting Entity**

East Christchurch Shirley Cricket Club (Inc) is incorporated under the Incorporated Societies Act 1908.

**Basis of Preparation**

The financial reports of the East Christchurch Shirley Cricket Club (Inc) are special purpose reports prepared for the Club Management Committee and Club members.

**Measurement Base**

The accounting principles recognised as appropriate for the measurement and reporting of financial performance on a historical cost basis have been followed by the Club. Reliance is placed upon the fact that the Club is a going concern and that accrual accounting is used to match expenses and revenues.

**Specific Accounting Policies**

The following is a summary of the significant accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements.

**(a) Accounts Receivable**

Accounts receivable are stated at their estimated net realisable value.

**(b) Inventories**

Inventories are valued at the lower of cost or net realisable value, on a first-in-first-out basis.

**(c) Fixed Assets**

Fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation except for playing gear which is stated at valuation. Buildings have not been revalued to the registered market valuation. Depreciation is calculated using rates considered appropriate by the Committee.

**(d) Goods and Services Tax**

The financial statements have been prepared on a GST exclusive basis.

**(e) Liabilities**

Liabilities are stated at the estimated amounts payable and include obligations which can be reliably estimated.

**(f) Grants and Donations**

Grant and donation income is recognised as income on receipt unless the Society has a liability to repay if the requirements of the grant or donation are not fulfilled. A liability is recognised to the extent that such conditions are unfulfilled at the end of the reporting period.

## Changes in Accounting Policies

Apart from adopting the applicable new reporting requirements for incorporated societies, there have been no material changes in accounting policies. All policies have been applied on a basis consistent with those used in the previous year.

## **7 PAVILION REDEVELOPMENT & SHIRLEY SPORTS CLUB LIMITED**

The Club entered into a Heads of Agreement and Joint Venture Agreement with the Shirley Rugby Football Club Inc. for the redevelopment of the existing pavilion in 2004. The project commenced in March 2005 and was completed in November 2005. Under the agreement, the pavilion is managed by the Shirley Sports Club Limited, a non-profit company established for this purpose. Each Club has equal shareholding and appoints three Directors. Under the agreement, "ownership" of the pavilion passed to the company at an agreed value and a notional gain on sale resulted. This was treated as an increase in member's funds in the 2006 year. During the 2015 year a further advance of \$5,000 was made and, by agreement, rent owing totalling \$27,000, net of GST, was deducted from the advance. As a result, the amount of the advance to the company was reduced. There have been no transactions of similar nature during the 2016 financial year. At balance date advances made by the Club to Shirley Sports Club Limited totalled \$254,660 (last year \$254,660).

**NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS****FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2017****1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES****Reporting Entity**

Shirley Sports Club Limited ("The Company") is a company registered under the Companies Act 1993. The Financial Statements of the Company are special purpose reports prepared for the Directors and Shareholders.

Accordingly, this special purpose report is not prepared in full compliance with generally accepted accounting practice (GAAP) and should not be relied upon for any other purposes or by anyone other than the Directors and Shareholders.

**Measurement Base**

The accounting principles recognised as appropriate for the measurement and reporting of financial performance and financial position on a historical cost basis are followed by the Company, with the exception of selected items for which specific accounting policies have been applied. Accrual accounting is used to match revenue and expenses. Reliance is placed on the fact that to company is a going concern.

**Specific Accounting Policies**

The following specific accounting policies which materially affect the measurement of financial performance and financial position have been applied:

**a) Receivables**

Receivables are recognised at estimated realisable value.

**b) Stocks**

Stocks are recognised at the lower of cost, determined on a first-in first-out basis, and net realisable value.

**c) Buildings, Plant and Equipment**

Buildings, plant and equipment are recognised at cost less aggregate depreciation. Depreciation has been calculated using the maximum rates permitted by the Income Tax Act 2004.

**d) Leases**

The Company leases the land on which the clubrooms are situated from the Christchurch City Council. The lease is for a 20 year term and there is an automatic right of renewal (to be negotiated). Lease payments are made on an annual basis and are recognised as an expense.

**e) Goods and Services Tax**

The financial statements have been prepared on a GST exclusive basis.

**f) Income Tax**

The Company has been granted a tax exemption under Section CW 46 of the Income Tax Act 2007 and no income tax is payable.

**Changes in Accounting Policies**

There have been no changes in accounting policies. All policies have been applied on

bases consistent with those used in previous years.

## 2. SHARE CAPITAL

The Company has issued 100 ordinary shares. These are held equally by the Shirley Rugby Club Inc and the East Christchurch Shirley Cricket Club Inc. At balance date, no share capital had been called up.

All shares have equal voting rights and share equally in dividends and surplus on winding up.

## 3. STOCKS

No stocks are specifically and separately pledged as security for liabilities. Stocks are subject to retention of title clauses.

## 6. ADVANCES - REDEVELOPMENT OF CLUBROOMS

The Shirley Rugby Football Club Inc (SRFC) and East Christchurch Shirley Cricket Club Inc (ECSCC) have advanced funds for the redevelopment of the Clubrooms under terms set out in a Heads of Agreement and Joint Venture Agreement. The project was completed in November 2005. The advances are interest free and technically repayable on demand. However, under the agreement, repayment in the immediate future is unlikely. During the 2015 year, a further advance of \$5,000 from each club was received and, by agreement, rents owing, net of GST, totally \$30,761 for SRFC and \$27,000 for ECSCC were deducted from the advances reducing the balance. The advances are currently - SRFC \$312,311(2016: \$312,311) and ECSCC \$254,661 (2016: \$254,661).

## 7. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

The Company has related party transactions with both the Shirley Rugby Football Club Inc and the East Christchurch Shirley Cricket Club Inc. By arrangement, rent of \$10,000 plus GST (2016: \$5,000) has been charged to each member club for the 2017 year. Future rents will be determined by the directors based on amounts considered appropriate by the directors to manage the company effectively. Rents have previously been based on an agreed formula. A new process for determining rents for member clubs was adopted from the year commencing 1 April 2015.

During the year Shirley Rugby Football Club Inc advanced \$100,000 to the company and

this was repaid in full prior to 31 March 2017.
