# **COMMITTEE OPERATIONS**

At the 2019 AGM:

- As has been the recent trend, attendance numbers at the AGM were again low, with the required quorum only just being met. As noted last year, finding sufficient members with the time and inclination to stand for the Committee is an ongoing issue. This makes it doubly difficult to institute some form of succession planning for the key Committee positions, as the appropriate candidates are not coming forward.
- We were fortunate that most of last year's committee were again available, and were re-elected with only minor changes. Dave Teale stood down after many years' service to the club, officially and unofficially, and Tom Dixon, due to work commitments, resigned as Treasurer but remained on the Committee. Josh Milne replaced Tom as Treasurer.

President Tim Grocott chaired the committee meetings.

Des Haines and Glenn Bongartz from the Junior Subcommittee were invited to attend committee meetings.

Four subcommittees operated throughout the season. Their responsibilities are given below, with convenors as noted.

- Activities Subcommittee (social and cricket events, publicity and promotion; communications; club fund-raising: convenor Hamish Teale)
- **Business Subcommittee** (finance, sponsorship & grant funds, subscriptions, planning & club management, membership, club records, liaison with SSCL board: convenor *Jeff Cope*)
- **Cricket Subcommittee** (training & coaching, player recruitment, team entries, grounds & practice facilities, gear, school liaison, awards, disciplinary; convenor *Donn Leckie*)
- Junior Subcommittee (managing the operations of the Junior cricket section; convenor Paul Cottam)

## A TRIBUTE TO JOHN GROCOTT (1937 – 2020)

On the 18<sup>th</sup> of January, 2020, the sad news came through that John had passed away. While we knew John had not been well for a few months and had had to reduce his weekly, if not daily, contacts with his beloved Easts, the news still came as a shock, and our sympathies went out to John's wife Lola and the Grocott family.

His like may not be seen again.

John had been at the heart of the club for over sixty years as player, coach, selector, administrator, supporter and promoter, a contribution unlikely to be repeated. It is impossible to estimate just how many lives John influenced over the years, but what can be said with some certainty is that we are all the better for having been in his company.

As a young man, John moved down to Christchurch from Wellington in 1956 and it was a fortunate day for all of us when, with the encouragement of Canterbury and New Zealand cricketer, Ian Cromb, John joined the East Christchurch Cricket Club. Back then, new members were formally approved for membership by the committee and the meeting minutes of 5 November 1956 formally record John's membership. What a great decision! (It's interesting to note that on the Committee that day were two familiar names, Brian Howarth and Peter Oakes, who were to become life-long friends of John.)

John played for the Easts' senior team as an opening batsman from 1956 to 1982, after which he made a few appearances in the lower grade sides before fitting comfortably into the Presidents Blue team until around 2010. John set a number of (then) records during his time in the Senior side, ending his career having played in 213 matches, scoring 7,308 in 363 innings, at an average of 21. He also snared 116 catches, mostly in slips.

But for John, joining a club did not begin and end on the playing field. Clubs don't run themselves. We don't have to go forward too far in his time with the club before we come across another entry in the minutes that will have a significant influence on the future direction of cricket in the east of Christchurch. At the AGM in September 1957 – less than twelve months after he has joined the club – John is elected Secretary. And so began a period of service to the club which would continue for the next sixty-plus years.

This generous and selfless contribution can't be underestimated, and it merits being set out for the record:

- President: 1974-77, 2006-12
- Vice President: 1962-74
- Treasurer: 1977-80, 2002-04, 2011-17, (co-Treasurer 2018-19)
- Secretary: 1957-1960
- Committee member: 1960-62, 2004-06
- Selector: 1980-84

In addition, for many of these years John was the club's delegate to the CCA.

It came as no surprise when John was made a life member of the Club in 1979.

Having been on the Committee with John for a number of years, I can attest to the many hours John spent each week on club affairs, whether it was sorting out the club's finances, ensuring grounds and player facilities were up to scratch or making sure our voice was heard in higher circles. John was a respected member of the executive team and we relied heavily on his guidance. He had high ethical standards and a natural sense of justice and, on contentious issues, his wise guidance was invariably right.

Not content with being player, selector and administrator, John also made a major contribution to the development of cricket in the east through his promotion and coaching of junior cricket. John was a key figure in establishing junior cricket at the club in 1958, and developing a junior coaching programme from1959 to 1971. It was a forerunner to the work carried out by the late Bill Duncan. He attained his Level 2 coaching grade in 1968. In the early 1980s he established the Saturday morning programmes for first-year players and, along with Bill, was instrumental in Easts being the first club in New Zealand to adopt the NZC Have-a-Go programme. It was only a few years ago that he formally retired from this junior coaching role.

In the 1998/99 annual report, Bill Duncan's comments sum it up. After commenting on the record roll of 409 Junior players, Bill (in a rare move) singles out John for thanks.

"John's contribution cannot be assessed, it is so wide and varied; he coaches our nursery children, encourages parents to assist him and coaches some of our women every Thursday".

Between the two of them, John and Bill introduced hundreds of youngsters (and their parents) to the game of cricket and helped develop our cricket community. Many of their young charges who went on to achieve some success in the game can probably trace their paths back to the sound foundations laid by the Junior programme designed and implemented by the pair.

In 2009-10, John was awarded the Sir Jack Newman Award for service to grass roots cricket in New Zealand.

We should also recognise the contribution John made to cricket outside the club. He was a delegate to the Canterbury Cricket Association in the early 1960s before becoming a Canterbury selector at Canterbury Brabin (Under 20) and Canterbury Rothmans (Under 23) levels. He was then appointed as a selector of the Canterbury Plunket Shield team in 1975-76 which won all Shell trophies available in that season. In the mid-1980s, John returned to under-age selections again as one of the Brabin team selectors. John was elected a Life Member of the Christchurch Metropolitan Cricket Association in 2015.

In 1960, the club, in search of a home, had recently shifted to McFarlane Park, Shirley, but further changes were in the air. The club was forming a relationship with the newly established Shirley Boys High School and, under the strong urging of the influential Charles Gallagher, first head-master of the school, a shift to Burwood Park was planned. This occurred a few years later, once the pitches had been developed and a small changing shed built.

John was a key figure in bringing about this shift and introducing a number of the associated changes.

The club was then known as the East Christchurch Cricket Club, but at the 1960 AGM, the following motion was successfully moved:

"That the East Christchurch Cricket Club merge with the Shirley Boys High School Old Boys Club, and the name of the clubs so merged be the East Christchurch – Shirley Cricket Ciub". Proposer: J.W.Grocott.

And, a bit later in the meeting, another motion:

"That the club colours be black, gold and blue". Proposer: J.W.Grocott.

So, the next time you play at Burwood Park, or write the club's name on the score sheet or don your playing cap, give a thought to John, who was instrumental in bringing them about.

John's other sporting love was basketball and he somehow found the time to build up an equally impressive resume as player, referee and administrator in that sport. His 60 years of service to basketball were honoured with many accolades, including the Sir Lance Cross Memorial Award for Exceptional Services to Basketball, Life Memberships of Basketball New Zealand and the Canterbury Basketball Association and a Long Service Award in 2018.

Few would disagree with the authors of our 2005 Centennial Publication who wrote:

*"Wherever help was needed, John Grocott stepped in with a minimum of fuss, but with maximum input into whatever role he was placed".* 

While they were referring to his roles in the cricket club, clearly the sentiments equally apply to the other areas John was involved in.

Over the years, John received many awards and accolades for his services to both cricket and basketball. While I'm sure these would have been humbly acknowledged and

received, the limelight and rewards of office were not what drove John. Rather, he preferred to put his energies into those things that mattered to him, and, for the Club, that was ensuring we had sound finances and the facilities and coaching programmes in place to be a successful club. What we have today is due, in no small part, to his efforts and we are all in his debt. As the Centennial report noted,

"John...feels a sense of achievement that the club, after so many years searching, has found a permanent home, with a clubhouse and practice facilities the envy of other clubs and with coaching structures in place that ensure the many newcomers are welcomed and catered for".

John was a very familiar figure at the club's pavilion and around the grounds, and even those few club members who may not have known him personally, knew him by sight. For the last few decades he enjoyed getting around the grounds to watch the lower grade sides, to meet the players and to welcome new members to the club. In many regards, John was the welcoming face of the East Christchurch – Shirley Cricket Club.

And when John was in the pavilion, you soon knew it. As son Tim said in John's obituary in The Press,

"He was larger than life....You always knew where Dad was because you could hear him talking and laughing."

And, as Tim poignantly added,

*"I think that's how we would like to remember him. Always happy, always talking, always interested in what you were up to and most importantly always happy to help out"* 

To finish with, a few deserved comments from his friends:

Ian Taylor (former NZ cricket selector/manager): "In keeping with Groc's wide group of friends, I salute him for a life that was full of achievement and for all the admirable personal qualities he constantly portrayed."

Roger Parlane: "His presence and enthusiasm will be sorely missed by the East Shirley family and the many other organisations he belonged to."

..and the final word from Matt Ritchens who posted this tribute on the Club's Facebook page, and which, perhaps, says it for us all:

"The word legend gets used far too often but there are really no other words to describe Mr Grocott and what he did for the club, its people, the region including other sports too. Yep, he was one of the nicest gentlemen you'd ever wish to meet but he worked so hard, so selflessly and without the need for any of the gratitude he so thoroughly deserved. I really can't speak highly enough about such a great man that I had the pleasure of dealing with for more than 20 years.

Rest well, legend."

# PRESIDENTS REPORT

The 2019-20 season started off extremely well with three new adult teams: the Strikers in Division 5, the Maharaja Super Kings in Division 6 and Presidents Black in Presidents Grade. Unfortunately, towards the end of the season, Covid-19 made an unwelcome appearance in Christchurch and club cricket was brought to an abrupt halt in the middle of March. While we had completed most of the season, it meant we weren't able to hold our usual award presentation ceremonies for the junior and senior clubs.

We had a number of excellent performances throughout the season, and the club should be very proud of what we achieved. Our Premier team won the Twenty20 title on Waitangi Day at Hagley Oval in a fine all round performance, highlighted by Tom MacRury's 87 and Ben Hanham 4/18. There was a lot of support for the team and it was a great afternoon of cricket. Tim Hampton-Matehe and Ken McClure were named in the Premiership Team of the Year.

Division 1 won the two day title, with Bradley Entwistle scoring five hundreds and 891 runs in the division and was the top run scorer across all adult cricket this season. The Tridents won Division 3, with Kings XI Punjab in second place, and Brijesh Patel the top run scorer and wicket taker in the grade. It is a shame that Brijesh wasn't able to join East Christchurch Shirley earlier in his career and been available for Premier cricket. Both Presidents sides were consistent throughout the season, with Craig Gibb and Jason Riach top scorers in the Grade. Craig was named season MVP for the Presidents Grade.

We were very pleased to win The Petersen Shield which is the symbol of overall club supremacy and goes to the club whose teams combine to be the most consistent during the season. This is a fine reward for all of those who work behind the scenes to select and organise teams, and ensure the best players are on the park each week.

Once again, I would like to acknowledge the work of our Senior Club and Junior Club Committees. These people put in hours of voluntary work to keep our club running and without their dedication and commitment the club would not be what it is today. The Junior section under the excellent leadership of Paul Cottam continues to be strong and the ongoing support of parents and whanau is great to see. A lot of work has been done with coach education and it is pleasing to see this come through in the performance of our young girls and boys. The hard work of the Junior Committee has paid off with an artificial wicket being laid on the western side of Burwood Park which will be a huge asset of the club in years to come.

We continue to be well served by people who do a lot of work throughout the week to ensure our teams are prepared, our playing and practice facilities at Burwood and Clare Parks are in good condition, and the clubrooms are in good shape. A huge thankyou to Pete Dunell, Donn Leckie, Harry Burson, Jeff Cope and David Grocott for their ongoing work. I also want to acknowledge our key sponsors Alan Stroud at O'Sheas and Gareth Greenfield from Cricket Express, as well as Des Haines, Southern Business Machines; Neil Michel - KB Electrics; Dean Hanham and Heather Warne - Hanham Transport. This year we welcomed Canstaff as a major sponsor and we really appreciate the support of Roger Parlane in getting this organised.

Lastly, just to acknowledge the loss of John Grocott on Saturday 18<sup>th</sup> January. John held virtually every role possible at East Christchurch Shirley since he joined in 1956. He was a player, senior captain, selector, committee member, Treasurer, Secretary, President and

Life Member and loved the club dearly. John was a lovely man who chatted to everyone and always had a kind word for everyone. It was nice to see a strong contingent of East Shirley people at his funeral, along with a large number from the wider community in Christchurch. John's personality and presence will be missed at Burwood Park.

# **COACHING AND SELECTION**

#### Men's Grades

#### Selectors

Premiership / Division 1 grades: Captains, Dave Grocott Other grades: Captains and Donn Leckie

#### Selection

Starting the 2019/20 season most of the Premier / Div. 1 playing squad returned, although the squad welcomed a number of new players: Nick Johnston (who returned to play after retiring two season ago), Landon Neal, Nathan Breen, Lasith Goonatilaka (for first part of the season), and Matt McClurg. Regan Sheahan, Phillip Smith, and Chris Berryman joined the squad at Christmas. Unfortunately, Jared 'Dutchie' Van Eyk Menkman was unavailable for most of the season due to work commitments and Talor Scott missed nearly all of the season due to injury. Several other players filled in at times when the squad was short and their willingness to help out is much appreciated.

Tim Hampton Matche was re-appointed as captain for the Premier Team and Hamish Teale took over the captaincy of the Div. 1 Grade side, although selection changes meant Jeremy Duncan, Ben Michel and Landon Neal also assumed captaincy roles on occasions.

As usual the club was able to field two strong teams at Premiers and Div. 1 Grade for the first few rounds of the season, but our depth was challenged at times when players were unavailable for the club due to representative or work commitments and injuries. However, we still had enough talent in the squad to select competitive teams each week. That said, building a consistently strong 2<sup>nd</sup> XI side continues to be a goal for the club into the near future.

The Premier team had three performance goals at the start of the season – to make the One Day and the T20 Semi-finals, and to finish in the top four for the Two Day competition. The Premier team achieved two of these goals by winning the T20 title and finishing third in the Two Day competition. Heading into what was to become the last Two Day round against frontrunners St Albans (due to the Covid 19 Lockdown) we were placed second and an outright win probably would have put us in first place. Unfortunately, a poor second day cost us and so we dropped to third place. Overall, the season would have to be classed as a successful one for the Premier team despite our disappointing one day compaign in the early part of the season. This team has the talent to make East Shirley continue to be a 'force to be reckoned with' in the coming seasons.

The singular goal for the Div. 1 Grade team was to win promotion back into the Championship Grade after being relegated to Division One at the end of the 2018/19 season. Disappointingly, the team did not achieve their goal, narrowly missing out to Sydenham in a tight race. Frustratingly, we beat Sydenham in 3 out of 4 games during the season, including an outright win by an innings and 50 runs, plus a One Day win by over 180 runs. Some below par performances against other teams at critical times came back to haunt us especially when the season was cut short by one game. Another huge frustration was the team believed they should have won the two day game against Merivale Papanui in what was to be the last game of season. A dubious umpiring decision at a critical stage of the game went against us and Merivale went on to win the game. If we

had won that game, we would have been the team being promoted to the Championship grade next season.

However, on a positive note the Div. 1 Grade boys won the Two Day title and made the One Day semi-final. They just missed out on making the T20 semi-final. The guys seemed to really enjoy their cricket after a tough previous season and with that came greater confidence, team work, more 'banter' and improved personal performances.

The whole promotion / relegation system is frustrating. Our second team was consistently the best team in the Division One Grade. Some of their wins were by huge margins. However, some below par performances, partly due to some players being promoted to Prems, had a major impact on the final placings. While we must look at ourselves first and foremost and recognise that we did not do enough to earn promotion, there are a number of issues that promotion relegation raises. The points tables are not always up-to-date and results from play-off games like semi-finals and finals are included which makes it more confusing (points from play-off games do not count towards promotion / relegation). This means you are never quite sure where the team is placed points-wise relative to other teams. Grades below Prems are umpired by players which can at times be contentious and some umpiring can have a significant impact on results. Weather can also have an impact, especially if a game against a lowly ranked team is rained off. Even factors such as losing the toss and getting the worst of the conditions can mean a lesser team can get an advantage over a better team. Cricket is a game where the best team does not always win the grade for factors mentioned above. The fact that one 'highly contentious' player umpire decision ultimately determined that our second team did not get promoted is extremely frustrating, has damaged relationships between two cricket clubs, and shows the fallibility of the promotion / relegation regime.

Our club is currently at a disadvantage having our second team in Division One. I believe as a Premier Club we should have a team in the Championship Grade which is where most second teams play. If this means Metro Cricket need to expand the Championship Grade to include more than 8 teams then so be it. From our club's perspective, it is more difficult to attract and retain new young players to the club and the lower standard does not help our top players who want to further develop their game or improve their form after coming down from Premiers. In particular, I would like to acknowledge those players such as Jeremy Duncan, Hamish Teale and Brad Entwistle who were clearly too good for that grade but remained loyal to the team/club and always gave their best to help the team.

Lower grade teams were mostly 'closed teams' with the captains selecting the teams under the watchful eye of Donn Leckie.

#### Coaching

Coaching at the senior level of the club was mostly focused around the Premier / Div. 1 squad. Pre-season training was held at the indoor nets at Mainpower Oval in Rangiora and was mostly well attended after a slow start. During the season the squad trained Tuesday and Thursday nights at Burwood. We continue to have very good practice facilities and practice as well as any club team in town.

Junior coaching was organised by Paul Cottam and the junior committee. This is largely based around parents coaching teams that their son/daughter played in. Tom MacRury from the Premier team also helped coach some of our club's junior teams and did some coaching on the Club's behalf at Shirley Boys High.

This season the East Shirley Cricket Club continued to run the Coach Mentoring, Support and Development programme in conjunction with Christchurch Metro Cricket. This scheme has been implemented by NZ Cricket. All coaches at the club were required to register and complete several online coaching modules and two practical sessions at either the Foundation or the Advanced Foundation level. This scheme is designed to improve the standard of coaching. This is a great initiative, but it does place extra pressure on some coaches who struggled to complete their online modules in a timely fashion due to family, work, and other commitments. A good number of our junior coaches completed the Coaching Mentoring programme by the end of the season. Well done to those coaches. Thanks to Paul Cottam for their help in implementing this programme.

#### Congratulations

Congratulations to our Canterbury Representatives Ken McClure, Leo Carter, and Blake Coburn. It is a pleasure to have you guys playing at the club.

Congratulations also to Tom MacRury, Tim Hampton Matehe, and Nathan McNichol who were selected for Canterbury 'A', and to Regan Sheehan who was selected for the Canterbury Under 19 Team.

It is great to see these players being recognised for their hard work and ability, as well as reflecting the talent we have in the Club. It is a testament to the 'good character' of these players that they always play for East Shirley and attend club practices whenever possible. The other squad members really appreciate the commitment and loyalty these guys show to the squad and the club overall.

Also congratulations to Tim Hampton Matche and Ken McClure who were named in the Christchurch Metro Premier Team of the Year.

Special mention must also be made of two players who had outstanding seasons with the bat at club level. Firstly, Brad Entwistle who scored a season aggregate of 929 runs at an average of 56 including five centuries (three of these were scored on three consecutive Saturday)]. Brad also took 18 wickets to highlight his all-round abilities. Secondly, Tim Hampton Matehe who, in addition to captaining the Prems side, also scored 825 runs at an average of 41 including three centuries (all of them unbeaten). If the last two Saturdays of the season had not been abandoned due to Covid 19, then these players may well have scored a magical 1000 runs for the season.

# PREMIERSHIP GRADE

With nearly all of the Premier team returning from last season, high hopes were held for a successful season. The aim was to win some silverware which we did by winning the T20 title. The season started slowly for us and it wasn't until the Two Day competition that we gained any momentum. We played our best cricket through the middle and latter part of the season. This was to be a season of outstanding individual performances with seven centuries being scored, two huge unbeaten partnerships, a 10-wicket bag for the match and two hat-tricks.

As losing finalist the season before, the team went into the One Day Competition with high expectations. However, our One Day performances were disappointing, and we finished with only two wins out of six completed games, to finish sixth overall. In a change from previous seasons, the One Day



competition was played over the first part of the season rather than during November and December. This meant all Premier teams struggled to play the attacking style of cricket normally associated with One Day cricket on the early season pitches which were seaming more and were slower in pace than the ideal. Certainly, our talented batting line up struggled to play the attacking stroke making innings they wanted to and we had several poor batting performances as a result. Upon reflection we probably needed to take a more conservative approach and build our innings slower rather than going hard early on. Weather also had an impact with our first game being rained off and the next 2 games being reduced overs affairs, both of which we lost. It wasn't until the 4<sup>th</sup> round that we got our first win. So, the team never built any momentum and our confidence suffered as a result.

There were some performances worth highlighting over the One Day season. Tim Hampton Matehe (109\*) and Ken McClure (121) both scored centuries against the hapless Heathcote. Nathan McNichol and Tom Gooday were the leading wicket takers with 11 wickets apiece and Blake Coburn was probably the best overall bowler with 8 wickets at the lowest runs per over of 3.21. Another highlight was the rare one-day hat trick taken by Tom Gooday against St Albans featuring two excellent catches.

Our T20 campaign was the highlight of the season with the team winning the T20 Final played on Hagley Oval on Waitangi Day. This was a special day for the players, and the club, with the opportunity to play on an international ground on a warm February day. Our opponents were long-time rivals Burnside West and the team put together a magnificent performance to win an exciting game by 19 runs. The standout performances on the day were a match winning 87 runs (off 46 balls) by Tom MacRury, Ken McClure scoring an intelligent 66\* and Ben Hanham picking up 4/18 off his 4 overs with his 'death' bowling. A big crowd turned out to watch the game and it was great to see so many East supporters spread around the ground giving their support and inspiring the team. A big thank you to those of you who turned up to cheer us on!

The other 'cool' aspect of this competition was a number of games were held on Thursday evenings and it was great for the lads to play in front of a good crowd of home supporters

on sunny evenings at the home of cricket. It created a good atmosphere and the supporters helped lift the team to some good wins.

We started the T20 season with two excellent wins over two strong teams in Burnside West and Lancaster Park. Tom MacRury had an outstanding day scoring 72 off 40 balls against BWU and then taking a hat trick against Lancaster Park, eventually taking 5/30. The team carried this momentum on to win their next two games as well. Then a slight hiccup, losing two out of the final three games. However, we qualified for a home semi-final against St Albans which we won by three runs in a tight last over finish, and then went on to win the final.

A key factor in our T20 win was the number of players performing consistently well. We had two batsmen aggregate over 200 runs in Tom MacRury and Dylan Goldstone and three others aggregate over 150 runs in Tim Hampton Matehe, Ken McClure and Ben Hanham. Tom MacRury (14w) and Ben Hanham (15w) also took the most wickets, highlighting their great all round T20 season. Young Regan Sheahan also did well taking nine wickets at a good economy rate of six runs per over. While these guys were the best performed statistically, all players in the team made valuable contributions and played their part. A great team effort!

In the Two Day competition we finished third, having three outright wins in the six completed rounds. If we had beaten the top team St Albans in what was to become the final round, we would have probably won the competition. However, we were well outplayed on the second day of that game and eventually finished in third place. One pleasing aspect of our Two Day campaign was our improved consistency from previous seasons. Three outrights wins plus being only eight runs away from a fourth outright win showed our Two Day game is improving.

There were several batting highlights in the Two Day competition. Tim Hampton Matehe (485 runs at an average of 60.25) and Ken McClure (308 runs at average of 77.00) were the leading run scorers. Leo Carter scored a magnificent 176\* against Heathcote combining with Tim Hampton Matehe (136\*) in an unbeaten 318 run partnership which was close to a club record. Tim was also involved in another big unbeaten partnership of 195 runs with Ken McClure against Sydenham with both players scoring 101\*. Ken also scored a classy 149 against Lancaster Park.

Blake Coburn and Nathan McNichol were the leading wicket takers with 27 apiece with Blake's averaging just 16.44 per wicket. Nathan had one standout performance taking two 5 wicket bags against Lancaster Park to finish with 10 wickets for 85 runs for the match. Tom Gooday, Connor Arnold and Ben Hanham also made useful contributions with the ball.

One other pleasing aspect of the season was the introduction of two youngsters Regan Sheahan and Brad Entwistle into the Premier side. Regan joined the club after finishing High School and Brad earned his promotion after some outstanding performances in the Div. 1 grade side. The calibre of these young players show that the club is in good heart going forward.

Finally, I would like to thank the club committee for their ongoing hard work and also our loyal group of supporters who turned up each Saturday. As a team it was great to be able to win some silverware. I would also like to thank all the players for their support and 'hard

yards' over the season. It was overall a very enjoyable season and I look forward to continuing our success next season.

Frustratingly, the eventual winners of the One Day competition were Sydenham, a team we had beaten twice, once by over 180 runs.

Notable performers in the One Day competition were Brad Entwistle with 449 runs at 64.14 including back-to-back-to-back hundreds (122, 110 & 151) and Jeremy Duncan with 478 runs at 59.75 with two hundreds (139, 130).

With the ball, Brad Entwistle (15 wickets at 12.93) and Nathan Harry (14 wickets at 19.57) led the attack, with Ben Michel showing his Premier experience controlling the middle



overs.

#### Twenty/20's

These were played either side of the Christmas break and started off well with two wins against Merivale and Heathcote. The first Saturday of the New Year didn't go to plan, losing both games to Halswell and Sydenham, which meant that going into the last round-robin game we had to win against Lancaster Park. We also needed other results to go our way because of the points system used for determining final placings in the Twenty/20 competition. We got the win but sadly did not make the cut in a three-way tie for the 2<sup>nd</sup> v 3<sup>rd</sup> place semi-final.

The core came from the former 3A/Hooters side that faded away in 2016; we then added in a few old 2nd graders from the 90's, a couple of old Presidents Blue orphans, and finally some parents and coaches from the junior side of the club combined to enter the Presidents Grade competition as the second Easts team.

It turned out that we were a talented and balanced squad, full of good characters that gelled well. We enjoyed our time on and off the field and compared to many sides in the grade we really benefitted from being a little younger.

Playing a new grade provided new challenges that many of us had not faced before, but we finished 4th equal; tied on points with the East Shirley Gold and Sumner teams. This was a pretty good result and can be described overall as a successful season. We had a good crack at the top teams, but at times struggled to cope with a style of cricket that is a little different to what we are used to.

Throughout our roster of 20 we had players with bat, ball and in the field that were of the highest quality in the competition, highlighted by having multiple players in the top ranks of the grade in each discipline. However, the most consistent and outstanding performances of note are:

- Jason Riach; 772 Runs at 70.18, from 15 innings with one hundred and eight fifties. Top score 104 not out in his last hit and simply the best bat in the grade.
- Matt Fleming; 28 wickets at 14.86 with best of 4/28 and economy of 3.69 which is absolutely brilliant, and equal third top wickets in the grade.
- Blair Harkerss; 28 wickets at 17.04 with best of 5/40 and economy of 4.12. Also scored 372 runs at 31, with three fifties and a top score of 93, and was equal third top wickets in the grade.

In the backroom, Rob Leys provided the impetus to get the team going. He canvassed interest and gathered the squad together over the winter in 2019, and then also provided funding to make it more attractive to get players onto the park. He deserves credit for getting this East Shirley Team into existence.

Also, Paul Cottam helped immensely with the admin of the side from week to week and also provided us with extra players from the junior coaches and dads during the year. I thank Paul for his work, though it is worth mentioning that he gave away more penalty runs behind the stumps than he scored with bat in hand, but this is forgiven.

Finally, several games were decided in the 80th over of the match, with only one of these in our favour. For the two that did not, they were both against the competition winners; Burnside and Merivale-Papanui. This leaves us looking back at those moments wondering what could have been if we had grabbed more opportunities throughout the season with both hands.

Regardless, we all had fun, made friends and it seems we will be back for another season in the springtime with a mostly unchanged roster.

# PRESIDENTS GOLD

The Gold team competed in what has become a very closely contested President's Grade with all teams capable of beating each other on the day.

With eleven teams entered, the competition reverted back to a double round robin format which favoured the teams able to put out a consistent team each week which was something the table topping Burnside West and Merivale Papanui sides were able to do best. We ended the season fourth equal (tied with the East Shirley Black team) with a 10 win / 7 loss record which was a respectable result but reflected the fact we were a little inconsistent at times.

The highlight of the season was comprehensively beating the competition winning Burnside team in both rounds, posting big scores against their imposing bowling attack and then defending well in the field. Two losses to our clubmates in the Black team were disappointing, albeit in evenly fought and enjoyable games. We had three last over losses, two on the last ball, which if they had gone the other way would have seen us right in the frame to win the grade.

Our bowling attack lacked penetration at times with no bowler managing 20 wickets for the season. It should be noted however that we played half our games on Burwood 3 which, with its flat wicket, lightning fast outfield and short straight boundary, proved to be something of a bowler's graveyard.

Arfur Daly was easily the pick of the bowlers despite playing the whole season with his mangled shoulder hanging together by a thread. He invariably bowled his overs on the trot in the middle of the innings at three runs per over or less, whilst consuming large amounts of painkillers.

Tim Grocott started the season on fire: however the wickets then dried up before he got his opening bowler mojo back in March. Tony Gray also uncharacteristically struggled for wickets before Christmas but started to show his international class toward the back end of the season. Steve Woodhouse added some much needed pace and aggression to the attack when he made a late start to the season and Duncan Clayton provided a point of difference with his left armers despite limited games.

As probably the most mature side in the grade, chronologically speaking anyway, our ground fielding and catching was exposed on occasions and cost us in some close games. The exception was Dean Iggo's keeping which was always top drawer. Special mention also to our super sub Angus McLeod who showed that age was no barrier to casually pouching slip catches.

Our top order batting was formidable when on song. The opening partnership of Alan Hemingway and Craig Gibb had a very productive season, and Tom Music and Dean Iggo also contributed well on a regular basis. Steve Woodhouse's power hitting in the middle order, along with Arfur, gave us momentum in the back half of the innings and helped post some winning totals.

Greg Fletcher, Richard Cherry, Niven Boyle and Johnny Robson all contributed to the cause on different occasions with the bat. Unfortunately Robbo's season came to an early end after a spectacular face plant under a high ball at Bradford Park.

Jimmy O'Connor and Joe Smith were also great squad members to have, just about always being available to play as needed. Jimmy was prepared to give anything a go and was tried variously as an opening bowler, death bowler, wicket keeper, mid-on specialist, and pinch hitter. His runs exceeded his wickets for the season which I believe is a rare event. Joe was new to the squad this year and chipped in with bat and ball.

We called on 23 players in total across the season and our manager *The Claw* (Steve Sharman) did a sterling job as usual in getting a team out each week. Anne McLeod was once again our scorer which was a great luxury to have and we thank her. Thanks also to Bob Neilson as our number one supporter who also managed one game.

Thanks for an enjoyable season and I look forward to the next one.



# TREASURER'S REPORT

I am pleased to present the East Christchurch Shirley Cricket Club Inc. Financial Statements for the year ended 31 May 2020.

The club operated a net surplus of over \$10,000 for the year, which is the first time a surplus has been generated in several years. This is primarily due to increased income through subscriptions, grant funding and funding / sponsorship arrangements with local organisations, while also generally reducing expenditure across the board. More detail, year on year revenue and expenditure can be found within the accounts for the year. I am happy to discuss these with any members or stakeholders if further details are requested. I note the accounts are subject to audit at the time of writing.

To re-emphasise comments from last year, a surplus position is essential to maintain equity and cash flow so the Club remains financially viable.

There are still many challenges facing the Club from a financial perspective. We are expecting reduced grant funding as an ongoing impact from the current pandemic and still owe a significant amount of rent to the Shirley Sports Club (\$10,000 at the time of writing). It is the intention of the committee to have paid most, if not all this outstanding rent during the year while still meeting our current obligations. In order to face these challenges, we, as a committee and club members, will need to be proactive and creative in fundraising and any other means of generating funds for the Club.

This year has seen many hours spent transitioning and tidying up systems and putting processes in place such as banking, Inland Revenue filings, Xero accounts and reporting generally. Although this has taken some time we are now in a position where these are all up to date and operating well.

During the year we opted to change Auditor from Ashton Wheelans to Christchurch Community Accounting. The reasons for this change are primarily cost based as the audit fee was a relatively costly exercise.

My thanks to various members of the Club and Committee. Namely, Tim Grocott, Jeff Cope, Donn Leckie and Harry Burson. Their assistance with a number of different financial areas is greatly appreciated. Paul Cottam and the Junior Committee also do a great job collecting subs, organising fundraising and helping with various other matters.

I would like to finish on a note acknowledging John Grocott, prior Treasurer for East Shirley Cricket. John was the Treasurer for many years before handing over. The work he did and time he gave is one of the main reasons the club continues to operate. John often personally assisted when cashflow was tight and the club was unable to pay accounts when they fell due. John went over and above what was expected of a member of the committee and will truly be missed by all.

## NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

## FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MAY 2020

## 1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### **Reporting Entity**

East Christchurch Shirley Cricket Club (Inc) is incorporated under the Incorporated Societies Act 1908.

#### **Basis of Preparation**

The financial reports of the East Christchurch Shirley Cricket Club (Inc) are special purpose reports prepared for the Club Management Committee and Club members.

#### Measurement Base

The accounting principles recognised as appropriate for the measurement and reporting of financial performance on a historical cost basis have been followed by the Club. Reliance is placed upon the fact that the Club is a going concern and that accrual accounting is used to match expenses and revenues.

#### **Specific Accounting Policies**

The following is a summary of the significant accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements.

#### (a) Accounts Receivable

Accounts receivable are stated at their estimated net realisable value.

## (b) Inventories

Inventories are valued at the lower of cost or net realisable value, on a first-in-first-out basis.

#### (c) Fixed Assets

Fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation except for playing gear which is stated at valuation. Buildings have not been revalued to the registered market valuation. Depreciation is calculated using rates considered appropriate by the Committee.

## (d) Goods and Services Tax

The financial statements have been prepared on a GST exclusive basis.

#### (e) Liabilities

Liabilities are stated at the estimated amounts payable and include obligations which can be reliably estimated.

## (f) Grants and Donations

Grant and donation income is recognised as income on receipt unless the Society has a liability to repay if the requirements of the grant or donation are not fulfilled. A liability is recognised to the extent that such conditions are unfulfilled at the end of the reporting period.

#### Changes in Accounting Policies

There have been no material changes in accounting policies. All policies have been applied on a basis consistent with those used in the previous year.

## 7 PAVILION REDEVELOPMENT & SHIRLEY SPORTS CLUB LIMITED

The Club entered into a Heads of Agreement and Joint Venture Agreement with the Shirley Rugby Football Club Inc. for the redevelopment of the existing pavilion in 2004. The project

commenced in March 2005 and was completed in November 2005. Under the agreement, the pavilion is managed by the Shirley Sports Club Limited, a non-profit company established for this purpose. Each Club has equal shareholding and appoints three Directors. Under the agreement, "ownership" of the pavilion passed to the company at an agreed value and a notional gain on sale resulted. This was treated as an increase in member's funds in the 2006 year. During the 2015 year a further advance of \$5,000 was made and, by agreement, rent owing totalling \$27,000, net of GST, was deducted from the advance. As a result, the amount of the advance to the company was reduced. There have been no transactions of similar nature in subsequent financial years. At balance date advances made by the Club to Shirley Sports Club Limited totalled \$254,660 (last year \$254,660). The advance is interest free and repayable on demand.

The Society has related party transactions with the Shirley Sports Club Limited. In the current year the club was charged rent of \$10,000 (2019: \$10,000). This reflects the current arrangement whereby rents are determined by the directors in consultation with member clubs based on funds required to manage the company effectively. The current basis was introduced from the year commencing 1 April 2015.

During the year under review, East Christchurch Shirley Cricket Club Inc. has transactions with committee members of the Society for expenditures incurred on behalf of East Christchurch Shirley Cricket Club Inc. These transactions were on a normal commercial basis.

President, Tim Grocott, Vice President, John Grocott (deceased 18 January 2020) and contracted club coach, David Grocott are related. During the year, David Grocott was paid

\$11,900 for coaching services in accordance with the contract. (2019: \$11,900) John Grocott advanced a loan of \$2,000 (2019: \$2,000) which is interest free and repayable on demand. John Grocott advanced a short term loan of \$4,000 during the year which was paid back during the year.
