5. General business.

Jeff Cope SECRETARY Another excellent season of cricket was held in 2021-22. Although the weather did not allow for all Saturday's to be played, there were still a number of fine team and individual performances.

The Premier side did not play as well as they would have liked and success in all competitions eluded them despite excellent performances from Tim Hampton-Matehe and Jed Roberts who topped the batting and bowling for the club. Our Division 1 side again performed strongly, but are still unable to gain promotion to the higher Championship grade. This continues to be a disappointment and is an ongoing issue that we are desperate to rectify. The coaching and organisation of these teams is of a high level. Thanks to David Grocott in his role as Club Coach and to Darrin Entwistle who coached the Division 1 side. Both men are making a great contribution.

Our afternoon grades remain strong. There were excellent performances from a number of players and the Strikers who were in their first season in Presidents Grade won the second round competition. Our Division 3 teams dominated their grade once again. The Sunrisers performed well and were led by Vikas Malik with the bat and Harish Sharma with the ball. It is great to see them take up the opportunity to play in the higher Division 2 next season. The Tridents were once again led by Brijesh and Alpesh Patel which led to them winning the Team of the Year and Alpesh was the club Player of the Season. It was excellent acknowledgement of his performance but also leadership of the team. Donn Leckie remains a crucial part of their success and his liaising each week with these teams is hugely valued.

Congratulations to our representative players Leo Carter and Ken McClure in Canterbury; Regan Sheahan with the Canterbury A; Tom Music with Over 50's; and Tony Gray with Over 50's and Over 60's.

I would like to acknowledge the work of our Senior Club and Junior Club Committees. There is a considerable amount of voluntary hours that go into running the club. The executive of the committee, Jeff Cope and Josh Milne do a great job ensuring we are financially sound and able to operate successfully. Jeff has secured considerable funding through a range of trusts, but the need for the club to look at further fundraising opportunities is required. It is likely that we need to upgrade our Number 1 wicket, and this will come at considerable cost.

The Junior section, led by Paul Cottam continues to be strong and it was wonderful to see the John Grocott Oval in use this season. To see cricket being played on the artificial wicket and the large number of supporters there to support their children puts our club in good heart for the future. The administrative work of the committee, and in particular Karen O'Donovan meant that she won the Dr. AJ Orchard Memorial Trophy for outstanding administrative service.

COACHING AND SELECTION

Men's Grades Selectors Premier / Divison 1 Grades: Captains, Dave Grocott Other Grades: Captains and Donn Leckie

Selection

Most of the Premier and Division One [2^{nds}] playing squad returned from last season and player numbers were strong heading into the season. There is a good blend of experience and youth in the squad which bodes well for the future provided players continue to 'improve their game'. With around 30 players in the squad and only 22 playing spots some players missed out on selection at times [especially early in the season]. With no suitable lower grade team for these players to play for this meant they missed out on playing that weekend. This was not ideal, and I appreciate the good grace and forbearance of those players who missed out on selection.

New or returning players to the squad were Nathan McNicol, Jed Roberts, Matt Munro, Tom McKay, Mitch McMillan [after Christmas] and Tyler Bruce [after Christmas]. Some key losses from the previous season were Blake Coburn [to Canterbury Country], Talor Scott [retired due to injury], Josh Milne [recovering from a back injury] and Jak O'Connell [who returned to Scotland]. Unfortunately, we also lost Hamish Teale who after joining the squad late snapped his achilles in his second game back and was lost for the season. It was also a shame to lose Tom Gooday to a season ending knee injury in November. This left the Premier team without two of its key performers from the previous season.

Tim Hampton-Matehe was re-appointed as captain for the Premier Team and Landon Neal as captain of the Division One (2nd) Grade side. When Landon was promoted to Premiers, Tom Dixon and Jared Van Eyk Menkman undertook captaincy roles. Further selection changes also meant other players also assumed Div 1 captaincy roles on occasions.

While the overall playing depth of the Premier/Division 1 squad has improved over the last few seasons there are some areas which the club/squad need to focus on developing. Our medium-fast pace bowling depth was much better this season with the return of Nathan McNicol and Jed Roberts, both of who finished in the top 10 overall wicket takers in the Premiers competition. However, our top and middle order batting was inconsistent at times and both teams need more batsman scoring 500 runs plus a season and averaging 25 or more. Tim Hampton Matehe and Landon Neale were the only batsman in the squad to score over 500 runs for the season. Admittedly, this past season had a number of Saturdays 'called off' due to weather and Covid but we still need our batsman's performances to be in the very good category rather than just good. I made the comment last year that the club has a number of useful 'all-rounders' and we really need some of these players to continue focussing on developing their batting skills and raising their expectations with the bat.

Another key area that the club needs to focus on is developing our young spin bowlers. The loss of Blake Coburn left a big hole in our spin bowling resources and his experience was missed. While our young spinners did an admirable job, we need our frontline spin bowlers to improve by taking more wickets and/or maintain a good economy rate.

This season was unusual with Covid affecting the competitions and 6 Saturdays lost to poor weather. This played 'havoc' with the various competitions and in particular the 50 over Competitions where nearly half of the rounds were washed out. One pleasing aspect of the season was that East Shirley did not 'abandon' any Prems or Div 1 games due to Covid. Metro Cricket made a ruling that if a team had more than 3 players sick with Covid then the game could be abandoned without penalty. Metro also decided an average points per game system would be used to decide final placings. Both these rulings were more than fair but there was a feeling that some teams used it to their advantage. As a squad it was decided that we were committed to playing every game. So even though we did lose some players to Covid we did not wave the Covid flag and always put two teams on the park. Only the Div 1 side were affected by this Covid ruling with St Albans unable to field a team for the final game of the season. This was a disappointing way for the Div 1 guys to finish the season.

The Premier team had similar performance goals to the previous season – to make the One Day and the T20 Semi-finals [or better], and finish in the top 2 for the Two-Day competition. Overall, the Prems team struggled to build any real momentum, playing well in patches and poorly in others. It was somewhat of a bizarre season at times, with poor weather having a major influence on competition placings. The team managed to qualify for the One Day semi-finals by winning 2 out of 4 completed games with 3 games being abandoned due to rain. The semi-final against Burnside summarised the inconsistency of the Premier team's season playing well at times but then failing to grab key moments and eventually being well beaten. In the Two-Day competition the team finished 6th with just the one outright victory. The T20 campaign is best not mentioned with the team failing to win a game although the last game against the Riccarton [the other bottom team] was rained off when we were well placed to win.

After a successful 2020-21 season the Division 1 team held high hopes of winning promotion into the Championship Grade which has been their goal over the last few seasons. Disappointingly, the team did not quite reach the heights of the previous season and did not achieve this overall goal. It continues to be tough for this team to get promoted. Any injuries or unavailability's in the Premier team means key players get promoted from Div 1 and are missing for key games which impacts on the team's performance. There were also changes to the captaincy which made it harder for the team to settle into a regular pattern. The highlight of their season was making the T20 final which they lost. They also finished 2nd in the Two Day competition but unfortunately lost 2 crucial games against the two Halswell sides. In the 50 Over competition the team only won one out of four completed games which ultimately hurt their chances of promotion. Despite the frustration of missing out on promotion, overall the Div 1 season was a successful one and if this group stays together for the next few seasons they will be a force to be reckoned with.

My usual end of season 'gripe' . . . the whole promotion relegation system continues to be a 'bone of contention' for our club. As a 'Premier Club' our club continues to be at a disadvantage to other clubs by having our 2nd team in Div 1. Obviously, it is more difficult to attract and retain new young players to the club and the lower standard of Div 1 does not help prepare our younger players for Prems. The continual focus on promotion for the Div 1 side [and avoiding relegation as was the case for the Prems team later in the season] burns up a considerable amount of emotional energy and detracts from the enjoyment of playing cricket. This said, going forward the onus is on our club to be better and earn promotion into the Championship Grade.

As in previous years lower grade teams were mostly 'closed teams' with the captains selecting the teams under the ever-watchful eye of Donn Leckie. Donn puts in a huge amount of time and effort in organising and monitoring these teams. Once again, Donn deserves a BIG THANK YOU for all the work he does. He continues to play a key role for the club.

Coaching

Coaching at the senior level of the club was focussed around the Premier/2A squad. Pre-season training was held at the indoor nets at Mainpower Oval and were well attended after a slow start. During the season the squad trained Tuesday and Thursday nights at Burwood. We continue to have good practice facilities and the players continue to work hard at improving their skill set. I would like to acknowledge Darrin Entwistle who helped out with coaching over the season. His input is valued and appreciated by both the players and myself. With both Darrin's sons, Brad and Ryan, playing for the club it is great to have another 'family connection' at the club. We look forward to Darrin continuing his involvement in the future.

Junior coaching was organised by Paul Cottam and the junior committee. This is largely based around parents coaching the team that their son/daughter play in. Paul and the junior committee do an excellent job in ensuring each junior team has a coach and a time to practice.

This season the East Shirley Cricket Club continued the Coach Mentoring, Support and Development programme in conjunction with Christchurch Metro Cricket and NZ Cricket. As in previous years all coaches at the club were required to register and complete several online coaching modules and 2 practical sessions at either the Foundation or the Advanced Foundation level. This scheme is designed to improve the standard of coaching and is generally working well. While this is a great initiative, it does place extra pressure on some coaches who struggled to complete their online modules in a timely fashion due to the family, work, and other commitments. Pleasing, a good number of our junior coaches had completed the programme by the end of the season. Well done to these coaches. Thanks to Paul Cottam and the junior committee for their help in implementing this programme. There are some slight changes to the programme being mooted for next year so watch this space!

Congratulations

Congratulations to our Canterbury Representatives Ken McClure and Leo Carter. Congratulations also to Regan Sheahan who was elected to play for Canterbury 'A'. It is a pleasure to have these guys playing at the club. The other squad members really appreciate the commitment and loyalty these guys show to the squad and the club overall.

Congratulations also to Jared Larsen, our club scorer, who was an official scorer for the test match between NZ and South Africa at Hagley Park in February. 'Larso' was also an official scorer for three games during the Woman's World Cup including being the media scorer for the World Cup Final between Australia and England at Hagley Oval.

PREMIERSHIP GRADE

Once again, the new season promised much. This was very much a different season with 6 Saturdays lost to rain and Covid rules affecting player availability and games in the later part of the season.

Our fast bowling stocks were strengthened with the return of Nathan McNicol and Jared Roberts, but lost key players Blake Coburn [Canterbury Country], Josh Milne [injury] and Talor Scott [retired from cricket]. We also lost key players Tom Gooday [knee] and Hamish Teale [achilles] due to injury for most of the season.

While the team put in some good performances at times, the overall feeling was the team underperformed this season and failed to capitalize on match winning situations. Whether this was due to "not getting the rub of the green" or a lack of experience or confidence it is hard to say. This caused some frustration and maybe players started trying too hard which had a negative impact on their performances. Whatever the reasons the team never really gained any momentum, and we finished the later part of the season with the pressure of a possible relegation 'hanging over our heads'. Thankfully, we avoided this with a comprehensive outright win in the last game of the season, but we do not want to be in the same position in future seasons.

One major issue for the team this season was the retirement of Talor Scott and the loss of Hamish Teale which left us without a 'genuine' keeper for much of the season. Due to studying for exams Hamish didn't join the team until late in November and then snapped his Achilles in the first game back which ended his season before it had started. We also missed Talor and Hamish's experience in our middle order batting.

A big thank you to Jeremy "Mr Fix It" Duncan who put his hand up to take the wicket keeping duties to help us out of a tricky situation. Jeremy ended up keeping for most of the season and did an admirable job taking 12 catches and 3 stumpings. Mention must also go to Myran Moore who came up from Div 1 to 'keep' for the last three games of the season and did an impressive job. We breathed a sigh of relief when young Mitch McMillan joined the squad at Christmas. Mitch is a keeper batsman and shows great promise. Unfortunately, Mitch had limited appearances due to rep commitments, injury and Covid. We are looking forward to having Mitch's services full time next season.

Standout performers over the season were Jed Roberts with 41 wickets at an impressive average of 16.27 and Nathan McNicol who took 39 wickets at 23.38. Our top batsman was once again captain Tim Hampton-Matehe who scored 664 runs at an impressive average of 30. Tim also took an incredible 16 catches in the field. Ken McClure and Leo Carter both scored heavily in their limited appearances and the team really enjoyed having these two guys play in our team. Regan Sheahan had his best premier season to date scoring 387 runs at 23 [with 3 fifties] and taking 16 wickets. Ben Michel and Ben Hanham also had some good performances with the ball. It was also pleasing to see the continued development of Brad Entwistle who had his best Prems season to date.

It was good to have some new guys making their Premier debuts for East Shirley this season. Congratulations to Mitch McMillan, Myran Moore, Tyler Bruce, Tom McKay and Matt Munro who all played their first games of Prems for East this season. Some more congratulations must also go to Tom Gooday and Maia who got married during the season; to Dylan Goldstone and Kaitlyn who also got married just before the season; congratulations to new parent's Ben Hanham and Tayla on the birth of Isla and also to Hamish and Emily Teale on the birth of Henry recently. The East Shirley family is growing!

The season started with three two-day games against three tough opponents in Old Boys Collegians, Lancaster Park and St Albans. Looking back, our first game against OBC 'set the tone' for how our 2 Day season would go, with the team being competitive for long periods but key lapses at critical times meant we did not seize key moments in games, and we did get the wins we expected.

The first game against a very strong OBC was reduced to a one innings affair on the 2nd day due to rain and was played at Warren Park. We lost to OBC by 6 wickets after posting a competitive 221 but we bowled poorly towards the end of the game and missed a couple of opportunities in the field.

Our next game was against Lancaster Park back at Burwood Park. This game was a close fought affair with momentum swinging both ways. An excellent 2nd innings bowling effort, including Nath McNicol getting 6/43 and Jed Roberts a hattrick, left us with 158 to win in plenty of overs. After a solid start, unfortunately we lost our last 6 wickets for 22 runs to frustratingly finish 12 runs short of what would have been an excellent win.

We then had to play St Albans who are typically the strongest team in this grade. We played well during this game although had a 1st innings loss. We had St Albans 7 wickets down in their 2nd innings but once they abandoned their run chase wickets proved hard to get. The highlight of this game was a magnificent 97 by Regan Sheahan who was cruelly denied a century in the quest for quick runs at the end of our 1st innings.

Our next game was against Heathcote in another one innings affair. In a bizarre day at Heathcote Domain, with hang-gliders disrupting play by repeatedly landing on the playing field and a lot of time spent looking for lost balls, our bowling attack got carved to all parts of the small ground. Ridiculously, Heathcote left us 388 to win in approx. 50 overs and despite giving it a crack early on we lost wickets and not surprisingly fell behind the required run rate. We eventually batted out the day finishing 238/5. Regan Sheahan continued his good form with 85 not out and Jed Roberts picked up 5/77 amongst the bowling carnage.

So, at this stage of the 2 Day competition we had played competitively but had little to show for it in terms of results. Two Dayers resumed in mid-February with games against Sydenham, BWU and Riccarton. The pattern for our season continued.

Against Sydenham we controlled the game except for the last session when Sydenham got away on us and chased down 192 to win by 4 wickets. Tim Hampton Matehe featured with 75 in our 1st innings. Again, missed opportunities hurt us. In the next game against BWU, we were largely outplayed but we batted out the 4th innings for a draw. Standout performances in this game came from Ben Hanham 5/18 and Jed Roberts 5/50.

So, in a season where we played well enough at times to deserve wins but did not grab key moments, we played the other bottom team Riccarton in the last game. There was a lot at stake as there was an outside chance that we could be relegated depending on results. Thankfully, we proved too good for Riccarton in this game getting our first outright win of the season by nervously chasing down 48 to win outright by 6 wickets. Jed Roberts continued his strong end

of season form with 6/34 and Landon Neal produced a scintillating 66 off 36 balls with five 6s and five 4s in our 1st innings.

Our final placing in the Two Day Competition was 6th out of the 8 teams. Ironically this was only one place lower than last season when we got three outright wins.

Heading into Christmas our attention moved onto the T20 competition which proved to be a disaster. After being a regular semi-finalist in the T20 competition over the last few seasons we let the ball drop this season. We lost six out of seven games with the seventh game against the other bottom team Riccarton rained off. In most games we were well outplayed and there were only two games [Heathcote and Sydenham] where we really competed. Put simply we did not consistently score enough runs and our batsmen lost confidence in their attacking game. While pitch conditions were not conducive to run scoring there were only 2 games where the team scored 140ish or better. Nathan McNicol was the leading run scorer and the only player to average over 20 for the T20 games. Jeremy Duncan and Tim Hampton Matehe were the other leading batsmen. Ben Michel was the leading wicket taker, with Ben Hanham and Jed Roberts close behind. We have a lot of improving to do for the T20s next season.

The 50 over competition was played over January and February. Only four of the usual seven games were completed due to three games being wash outs. In those four games we recorded 2 wins and 2 losses.

The wins were convincing. We won by 125 runs over Lancaster Park after amassing a huge 283/6 on the back of 128 by Ken McClure century and 91 from Leo Carter. In the next game we then scored 309/6 against Heathcote in our most complete batting performance of the summer with Dylan Goldstone scoring 81 and all our top 5 batsmen scoring 30 or more. We dismissed Heathcote for 201 to register a 108 run win.

Our two losses were to BWU by 2 wickets in a tight contest and to Sydenham where they chased down 188 after we had them 16/4 early on in their run chase. Ken McClure continued his good form with 83 in this game. We could have won both games but failed to capitalise on opportunities in the field to take wickets.

The two 100 run wins gave us 2 crucial bonus points which meant we sneaked into the semifinals as 4th qualifier. The game was against Burnside West at Burnside Park. We got off to a promising start with Dylan Goldstone and Tim Hampton Matehe putting on 86 for the first wicket off about 25 overs and it looked like we would post a 200 plus score. However, despite losing our 2nd wicket at 120 our innings steadily lost momentum in the face of some tight bowling. We were eventually bowled out for a slightly disappointing 180 which was probably 30-40 runs less that what it looked like we would get. We fought hard in the field but Burnside proved to be the better team on the day and chased down the target with 5 wickets down and plenty of overs to go.

Ken McClure, Tim Hampton Matche and Dylan Goldstone were the best performers with the bat during the 50 over competition and Jared Roberts and Nathan McNicol were the leading bowlers.

At the end of the season Hamish Teale announced his retirement from cricket due to family and work reasons. 'Tealo' has been a regular player in the Prems team for a number of years and he was Easts player of the season in 2016/17. Hamish was originally selected as a batsman but he later became keeper for the Prems side. Tealo has also spent time on the club committee. Hamish's statistics according to Metro Cricket read as follows: in 2 day cricket Hamish played 49 games scoring 1440 runs at 23.61 with a 1 century (125) and 5 fifties, 45 catches and 11 stumpings. He even has 2 wickets to his name! In 50 over cricket Hamish played 60 games

scoring 1439 runs at 24.81 with 8 fifties (HS = 91), 27 catches, and 2 stumpings. According to T20 statistics [which appear incomplete] Hamish played 29 games, scoring 428 runs at 17.83. Hamish's positivity, enthusiasm and club mentality will be missed by all the Prems squad. We all look forward to seeing Tealo around the club in future [make sure you keep your playing kit in the car Tealo!]

Finally, thanks to all the players who have played for Prems this season. It was a tough season and your efforts are valued. Thanks also to our friends and family supporters who regularly come down to watch us play, your support is appreciated. Thank you also to Cocopellis at the Palms for their sponsorship of Polo Shirts for the squad. Hopefully, despite our relatively 'rough ride' everyone had an enjoyable season and are looking forward to doing better next season.

DIVISION 1 GRADE

As playing through One Day and T20 champions from last season, the team was confident heading into the new season. Most of our squad returned and with new additions such as Matt Munro, Tom McKay and Tyler Bruce the team had a good blend of seasoned campaigners and youth. This season was impacted quite heavily by weather (and Covid) and maybe conditions didn't quite suit our style this season as we did not play as consistently well as the previous season.

This team continues to have an excellent team spirit and the players really enjoy being part of the atmosphere. Darrin Entwistle made the following comment ... "This team continues to have one of the best cultures I've seen from any team I've been involved with, or played in. The lads support each other and the more experienced ones help the younger ones blend in and make them feel welcome. That's really important when a school cricketer starts playing club cricket."

There were a couple of changes to our competition this year with the games starting at 12.00 noon rather than 10.30 which upset a few of our players who want to play all day cricket. The grade was also expanded from 6 to 8 teams and the new teams lacked the usual cricket etiquette which has normally existed in this grade. Remarkably one team this year just stopped playing in the middle of a session to have a rest for 20 minutes despite our protests. Some teams over rates were slow and some games annoyingly were finishing around 7.00pm which defeats the purpose of starting later. While we aren't perfect, some player umpiring was also questionable. Maybe some of these issues caused us to become frustrated and lose focus and this might explain some under-par performances. However, we need to look in the mirror first and foremost and be better if we are to overcome these difficulties.

Promotion into Championship Grade has been a goal for this team for the past three seasons and it now almost seems to be a 'cross to bear' for the team. The constant pressure the players and the team are putting on themselves to perform well and win games has been mentally and emotionally draining on the team and is possibly started to have a negative effect on performance. Maybe the time has come for this team to just go out and play cricket for fun and enjoyment and 'what will be . . . will be' in terms of gaining promotion. By taking a more relaxed, and game by game, approach maybe we will play well enough to win all three of the T20, One Day and Two Day competitions.

T20

The T20 Season was probably the highlight of the season. We won 4 out of 7 games heading into the semifinals finishing with 4 wins and remarkably one tied game. There were convincing wins over St Albans, Heathcote, Merivale Pap, and Halswell Lions. Remarkably the game against Sydenham ended in an exciting tie when we failed to score enough runs off the final ball and both teams ended on 119 after 20 overs.

We finished 3rd in the round robin so had to play our nemesis Halswell Vikings in the semifinal. A great all round team effort saw a convincing win by 7 wickets with nearly 5 overs left to bat. The next day we had the final against Marist on Hagley Park [old Hospital Corner] Unfortunately we probably played our worst game in the final and were well beaten. For some reason we were not quite on our game and missed some crucial opportunities to take wickets in the field allowing Marist to set a competitive 147 to win. Our run chase started disastrously losing key batsman early and we were reduced to 17 for 6 in only the 6th over. A fighting partnership between Tom Dixon (38) and Tom McKay (26) gave the team some hope but there was too much to do, and we were bowled out well short.

Standout performers in the T20 competition were Cullen Sheahan (182 runs at 60.67, strike rate = 134) and Mintu Singh (16 wickets at 8.75, runs per over = 5.96) and Tom Dixon (92 runs at 30.67, 8 wickets at 19.88, rpo = 5.89)

One Day

As playing through One Day Champions high hopes were held for our One-day campaign but ultimately it proved disappointing. Weather played a major part with 3 games being washed out and accordingly the team struggled to build any momentum. We ended up winning only one of the four completed games. Three poor batting performances where we were bowled out for less than 100 resulted in three losses and meant we missed out on making the semis-finals. To be fair we did not play well enough to deserve a spot in the semi's and we will have to be better next season. The three losses also hurt our wider promotion relegation chances as the other top teams in the grade got a significant jump on us points wise by gaining more wins. Our best batsman in the One Day games was Tanurag Singh scoring 93 runs at an average of 31. Bowling wise Tom McKay, Reuben Stoffers and Mintu Singh had some good performances in the limited opportunities they had.

Two Day Competition

Our Two Day campaign was much more convincing and we finished 2nd to Halswell Vikings [who had the luxury of an extra game in which to improve their average points]. While we played well it just seemed at times that we did not get the 'rub of the green' in this competition.

There were three convincing outright wins over Marist [by 10 wickets], Merivale Pap [by 150 runs] and Sydenham [by 76 runs]. There were two rain affected games which were reduced to one innings affairs and we came frustratingly close to winning both, with Halswell Lions sneaking past our score nine down and we had Heathcote eight wickets down but we ran out of overs to dismiss them. If we had won these two games then we would probably have won the competition. The other frustration was our last game against the bottom placed St Albans was abandoned due to St Albans playing the 'Covid card'. All things being equal, we would have probably won this game convincingly and it may have given us a chance to win the 2 Day competition. However, we were well beaten by the eventual grade winners Halswell Vikings in another game in which our inconsistent batting hurt us.

Overall the 2 Day campaign was a success and there were a number of good performances. Landon Neal captained the side well [when he wasn't playing Prems] and was outstanding with



the bat scoring 349 runs at an average of 58. Tom McKay and Ryan Entwistle showed their allround ability with both scoring approx. 200 runs. Tom's century 111 off 65 balls was arguably the performance of the season and really got the team buzzing. Old warhorses Tom Dixon and Jared 'Dutchie' Van Eyk Menkman were the leading wicket-takers while spinners Matt Munro and Cully Sheahan both got 5 wicket bags to help win games and produced excellent season averages. Chris Berryman also rates a mention with his 5/18 against Marist Harewood.

Finally, a couple of thank-yous. Firstly, to Darrin Entwistle for his coaching and support both at games and at trainings. Secondly to our hardy supporters who often have to sit in cold windy conditions to watch us play. Thank you also to Cocopellis – the Gourmet Pizza Bar down at the Palms who sponsored the team by providing Polo Shirts. And lastly a big thank you to all the Div 1 players for their efforts this season, both at training and during games. Hopefully, everyone has had an enjoyable season and are looking forward to next season where we can do it all again.

The team went to O'Shea's basically every week after the game, including at times when there was no game and spent around \$3000 at the pub on food and drinks. JUNIOR REPORT

Once again we have been fortunate to have an excellent junior committee which made the job of convenor very manageable and enjoyable. A committee of seven divvied up responsibilities very well and pulled together for a well-run season that had its Covid challenges, culminating in a well-attended end of season prize giving in March. Although we had the Covid impact of not holding our Xmas event, we still managed to hold several team evenings as in previous seasons.

These results of course could not happen without all the junior coaches and the helpers within their teams, so a massive thanks to them for what certainly appeared to me to an enjoyable season for the children which is of course what it's all about.

Sponsor support was received from Des Haines' Southern Business Machines, Heroes Burgers, and Parklands Subway.

We had 170 juniors across seventeen teams which we thought was pretty solid. A highlight was working with Cat Quinn from Southern Districts (and CJCA staffer) to form a combined Year 7 and 8 girls team with them, called South East Otautahi. This is an important step for encouraging and supporting girls cricket for both our club and in eastern Christchurch. Cat is keen to coach the team again with most of the same players, and to keep developing girls teams under the South East Otautahi banner.



One of the strengths of our club is the parent-driven coaching of our junior teams, with many finding that they are able to perform this role whatever their sporting background may have been. New coaches, and assistant coaches stepping up, included Henk Stoffers (returning coach), Matt Richens, Shaun McWhirter, Craig Neville, and Grizz McGuire. Special thanks to Kere Reihana for coaching a team where there was a gap, and to those parents who supported the coaches in the running of the teams.

Karen O'Donovan again did an outstanding job of running the administration and registration process well, Ann McLeod took care of uniforms, Angus McLeod oversaw the gear, with Tracey Painter and Suzy Broughton helping out with events and activities. Other members of the committee were of course a couple of coaches, Scott Bennett and Glen Bongartz. With Glenn finishing up, Phil Black and Ross Martin have helpfully volunteered their services.

Our main fundraising activity was the Naked Baker pies, this time the 'four pack' option, which proved to be popular and successful.

The big highlight this season was the commencement of games being played on the John Grocott Oval, the junior artificial pitch on the old bowling club at Burwood Park. The first game was a test of the surface and outfield in the form of a pre-season game between last season's Year 8 players and this season's Year 8 players. The outfield played well, and convinced everyone present (including CJCA, special thanks for their funding to help develop the outfield) that games should start. Over the course of the season all our hard ball teams played several games, both morning and afternoon, always enjoying it. We've gone from having no hardball games at Burwood to having two every Saturday, a terrific result.

There's still more work to do on the Oval outfield, which will be an ongoing focus. Special thanks to Glenn and Tracey for sourcing K-lines so that we are in a position to irrigate the outfield. We've also further developed our relationship with the Council, who have improved the water outlet to allow us to use the K-lines (although a damp autumn meant that we didn't have to), and we'll work with them to extend the current irrigation lines to assist with watering (thanks to Angus McLeod as well for his work on this). Although a rogue vehicle unfortunately got onto the grounds and damaged the outfield on the Oval outfield, the Council have kindly agreed to remediate and at the same time carry out drill seed and weed control work on the outfield.

We were also successful in working with the Council to get the very badly worn run-up area in training nets on the lower field replaced with a full artificial surface, now among the best in town, and with Council acknowledging ownership of the nets the next step will be to replace the surface within the nets.

We had 24 juniors take part in the spring and/or summer CJCA festival tournaments:

- Plus of course thanks to the big effort their Easts coaches put in supporting them at the tournaments.

Look forward to seeing everyone again next season (we've already started planning for it!) to keep building on some great momentum.

TREASURER'S REPORT

I am glad to present the East Christchurch Shirley Cricket Club Inc. Financial Statements for the year ended 31 May 2022. The Club operated a net loss of \$696 for the year which is the first loss since the 2019 financial year. Although a headline loss is not a fantastic result, we had a cash surplus for the year when depreciation is considered. We forecast an expected loss for the year due to decreased income across the board and increased ground costs, I believe it is a good result that the loss was minimised to less than \$1,000.

We currently have no outstanding liabilities at year end with a healthy bank account and grant funding already coming in for the new financial year. This is a marked improvement from a few years ago when we had significant rent owing to the Shirley Sports Club and it was not clear where the funding would come from to clear this, while still needing to provide playing facilities and equipment for both senior and junior clubs. I consider it a great achievement over the past 2-3 years for the Club and committee to have cleared all arrears and now be in a position to start a new financial year with no concern for moneys owing from the previous year.


In saying that, we rely heavily on grant funding, donations and sponsorship so it is important that these income streams are maintained and increased where possible. I encourage anyone with ideas and connections to assist the committee going forward with fundraising and sponsorship opportunities.

On a personal note, and as I have advised the Committee, I will now be stepping down as Treasurer. I have enjoyed my time as Treasurer of the Club and hope I have managed to add some value to the Club operations over the past 3 years. Unfortunately, I cannot continue to commit the time and attention that the role requires. With audits still outstanding I will continue to work with the committee and auditor to close these out before completely handing over.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MAY 2022

1.STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Reporting Entity

East Christchurch Shirley Cricket Club (Inc) is incorporated under the Incorporated Societies Act 1908.

Basis of Preparation

The financial reports of the East Christchurch Shirley Cricket Club (Inc) are special purpose reports prepared for the Club Management Committee and Club members.

Measurement Base

The accounting principles recognised as appropriate for the measurement and reporting of financial performance on a historical cost basis have been followed by the Club. Reliance is placed upon the fact that the Club is a going concern and that accrual accounting is used to match expenses and revenues.

Specific Accounting Policies

The following is a summary of the significant accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements.

(a) Accounts Receivable

Accounts receivable are stated at their estimated net realisable value.

(b) Inventories

Inventories are valued at the lower of cost or net realisable value, on a first-in-first-out basis.

(c) Fixed Assets

Fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation except for playing gear which is stated at valuation. Buildings have not been revalued to the registered market valuation. Depreciation is calculated using rates considered appropriate by the Committee.

(d) Goods and Services Tax

The financial statements have been prepared on a GST exclusive basis.

(e) Liabilities

Liabilities are stated at the estimated amounts payable and include obligations which can be reliably estimated.

(f) Grants and Donations

Grant and donation income is recognised as income on receipt unless the Society has a liability to repay if the requirements of the grant or donation are not fulfilled. A liability is recognised to the extent that such conditions are unfulfilled at the end of the reporting period.

Changes in Accounting Policies

There have been no material changes in accounting policies. All policies have been applied on a basis consistent with those used in the previous year.

8. PAVILION REDEVELOPMENT & SHIRLEY SPORTS CLUB LIMITED

The Club entered into a Heads of Agreement and Joint Venture Agreement with the Shirley Rugby Football Club Inc. for the redevelopment of the existing pavilion in 2004. The project commenced in March 2005 and was completed in November 2005. Under the agreement, the pavilion is managed by the Shirley Sports Club Limited, a non-profit company established for this purpose. Each Club has equal shareholding and appoints three Directors. Under the agreement, "ownership" of the pavilion passed to the company at an agreed value and a notional gain on sale resulted. This was treated as an increase in member's funds in the 2006 year. During the 2015 year a further advance of \$5,000 was made and, by agreement, rent owing totalling \$27,000, net of GST, was deducted from the advance. As a result, the amount of the advance to the company was reduced. There have been no transactions of similar nature in subsequent financial years. At balance date advances made by the Club to Shirley Sports Club Limited totalled \$254,660 (last year \$254,660). The advance is interest free and repayable on demand.

President Tim Grocott and contracted club coach, David Grocott are related. During the year, David Grocott was paid \$11,975 for coaching services in accordance with the contract. (2021: \$11,975).
