PRESIDENTS REPORT

East Christchurch Shirley Cricket Club was once again proud to provide another season of quality cricket and I want to thank everyone for their support of the club.

The Premier and Division 1 sides continue to perform well but are not consistent enough to be challenging for trophies. The quality of players is good, but we are just not getting the top-quality runs and wickets on a regular basis to get the results they are capable of. It is not far away, and I look forward to seeing this happen in the near future. David Grocott does well coaching and organising our Premier and Division 1 sides, and we are well served with his expertise and commitment.

Our success came this season from the Division 2 Super Sunrisers. They had an outstanding season and won two of their three competitions. They won Team of the Year and Vikas Malik won Player of the Season. This was a fine achievement from a group of players who have made a positive contribution to the club. The Tridents were once again led by Brijesh and Alpesh Patel and they also won the Division 3 competition. The Shirley Sports Club administers the clubrooms and means that the East Christchurch Shirley Cricket Club can focus on the playing and administrating of cricket and do not need to worry about the bar and facilities in the clubrooms. Roger Smith has done a great job running the bar and the clubrooms for many years and has decided to step down from this role. I want to thank Roger for all of his work and administration with the Shirley Sports Club.



A Farewell to Trevor (TG) Hayes 1939-2022

It is with sadness that we note the passing of one of East Christchurch Shirley's life members, Trevor Hayes.

Trevor joined the Club in January 1958 and had a continuous association with the club lasting over 60 years as a player, an administrator and more recently as a supporter.



On the field, TG played for 50 seasons, from Seniors to Presidents and, ever the watchful statistician, moth-balled his bat in 2008 as soon as he had chalked up the remarkable feat of scoring 10,000 runs for the club.

TG had a true love of the game and off the field made a significant contribution to the club. He served as Club Captain, was the long-serving Treasurer in the 1960's and 1970's and Club President from 1977-81, during which the Club celebrated its 75th Jubilee. He also helped organize the Centenary celebrations. His knowledge of monetary matters and sage judgment ensured the smooth sailing of the club while he was at the helm and he played an influential part in the building of the original clubrooms which housed Easts so well until being replaced by the 2005 developments.

Trevor was elected a life member in 1984.

Trevor and wife Rosalie had the cruel misfortune to lose their son Richard, a capable lower grade player for the club, in a climbing accident in the Mount Cook National Park on December 20, 1990. A trophy in his memory, dedicated to the most improved player under 21, was given by the family and many of its winners have gone on to represent the Club with distinction.

Trevor will be sorely missed and our thoughts go out to his wife Rosalie and family.

Selection

Once again, the majority of the Premier and Division One [2^{nds}] squad returned from last season although there were the usual player changes that occur from season to season. Squad numbers were slightly down on last season but looked solid enough heading into the season. The squad had a good blend of experience and youth in the squad so both teams were excited about their prospects for the season. As usual I would like to acknowledge those players who missed out on selection from time to time. Selection is difficult at times and selection decisions are not taken lightly. It is disappointing for the players who miss out especially when there is no suitable lower grade team for these players to play for. Once again, I appreciate the good grace and forbearance of those players who missed out on selection.

A handful of new players joined the squad for this season; Caleb Donaldson, Nick Munro, Mitch Van Der Plas, Rhys Petrie and Riley Tempero joined the squad and helped bolster the Div 1 side. Some key losses from the previous season were Dylan Goldstone, Connor Arnold, Reuben Stoffers, Mintu Ror, Cullen Sheahan and Brad Van Eyk Menkman. Hayden 'Dorsil' Clark, who was a squad member, was effectively lost also as he only played a few games due to work commitments.

Tim Hampton-Matehe was re-appointed as captain for the Premier Team and Ben Michel graciously put aside his Premiership aspirations to lead the Division One (2nd) Grade side. Both these guys did an admirable job over the season. Thanks for your efforts Tim and Ben, being captain is not an easy job!

The overall playing depth of the Premier/Division 1 squad remains solid although it was noticeable during the season that the standard between the top Premier players and the rest of the squad appears to be getting bigger. We need more Div 1 players to work hard at developing their game and have dominant performances in Div 1 so they are ready to play Prems and push for spots in the Prems team.

Our medium-fast pace bowling has been strong over the last few season with players like Jed Roberts [once again our top wicket taker in Prems], Nathan McNicol, Ben Hanham, Jared Van Eyk Menkman and Tom Gooday [although injured most of the season]. However, with the loss of Ben Hanham [retired for family reasons], Nathan McNicol [playing elsewhere], and possibly Jed Roberts, this is going to leave a big hole in our pace bowling depth. We are going to need some of our young pace bowlers to step up to fill this void.

Our batting in Prems this season was better with three players in particular standing out; Regan Sheahan, Landon Neal, and Tim Hampton Matehe [Ken McClure and Leo Carter aside]. All these players scored 500 plus runs for the season with Regan having an outstanding season scoring over 700 runs. In Div 1, the top and middle order batting continues to be a 'work on'. Only one player [Nick Munro] scored over 400 runs and the team simply isn't scoring enough

runs to win games. The young batsman in the squad need to lift the bar and demand more of themselves both technically and mentally to be better players.

Our spin bowling resources in the squad looked good at the start of the season although we were lacking a little in experience. We had a good range of spinners in the squad with 3 left arm orthodox spinners in Regan Sheahan, Ben Michel and Tom Dixon, 2 right arm off spin bowlers in Nick Munro and Matt Munro, plus a leggie in Caleb Donaldson. It was pleasing to see these guys mostly perform well with the ball although the club needs these guys to be even better. Ben Michel with 46 wickets in Div 1 was the standout spinner and Nick Munro also deserves a mention with his 36 wickets. The loss of Regan and Matt [both moving to Australia] means the Prems side will need someone to step up as a regular front line spinner for next season.

Of particular concern at the moment is our thin wicketkeeping stocks. In the last 2 seasons we have lost 3 wicket keepers from the Prems squad. We started the season with only 2 keepers in Mitch McMillan and Myran Moore. We lost Mitch to a season ending injury at Christmas. Myran did a great job stepping up to Premier grade but this left the Div 1 team without a specialist keeper. After some 'juggling' around Chris Berryman eventually took up a keeping role for Div 1, a job he did admirably. However, this issue needs to be resolved for next season.

Just got a special mention for a couple of Prems players who have represented the club with pride over several years who are 'moving on' for different reasons.

Firstly to Ben Hanham who has decided to retire for family reasons after playing 202 games for the club. Ben has been an integral part of the Premier side over the last decade or so. He is an awesome club man and his all-rounder skills and calm manner will be sorely missed by the team. In his Premier career Ben has amassed 3068 runs with ten fifties, and taken 194 wickets with the ball. His fielding has always been outstanding and his uncanny athleticism resulted in a number of runouts and 111 catches. I am sure Ben (and his supporters!) will still be seen around the club in the seasons to come.

Secondly to Nathan McNicol another long serving member of the Prems team who has decided to try his luck playing elsewhere. Nathan has played just over 100 games for the club and has taken 220 wickets as the teams primary opening bowler including eight 5 wicket bags. He has also scored 703 runs for the club along with 34 'grabs'. Naths humour and enthusiasm will be missed around the team. We wish Nath all the best except when he is playing East Shirley!

Thirdly to Dylan Goldstone who has had an association with the club going back to when he was a junior. Dylan did not play for the club this season, but he has made a valuable contribution as a hard hitting opening batsman over the last four seasons. He did previously play for the club but in the last four seasons Goldy has scored just under 2000 runs at an average of 23. His most memorable innings was a faultless 116 in a one day game on a difficult pitch where most batsmen struggled. All the best Goldy ... hope to continue to see you around the club.

Lastly a brief mention of Blake Coburn who has retired from List A/First Class Cricket. While Blake is not currently a member of the Prems side he did spend 5 seasons at the club. In that time he played over 80 games for East and captured 194 wickets. He also took 53 catches and scored 612 runs. We wish 'Coey' all the best also in life after cricket and would love to have him back playing at the club if he wants to continue his club career.

The Premier team had similar performance goals to the previous season – to make the One Day and the T20 Semi-finals [or better], and finish in the top 2 for the Two-Day competition. Overall, the Prems team played better than last season, playing well in most games and generally being

more consistent. The team finished 5th in the Two-day competition but with more luck would have finished higher. In the One Day competition the team also finished 5th, just two bonus points away from qualifying for the semi finals. As per last season the team struggled in the T20 competition with only 2 wins but a third win would have placed them 4th equal in a tight competition.

The main goal of the Div 1 team was to win the elusive promotion into the Championship grade. Unfortunately, this was not to be and in the end the team were well away from winning promotion. It continues to be tough for this team to get promoted. Any injuries or unavailability's in the Premier team means key players get promoted from Div 1 and if they are missing for key games this impacts on the team's performance. The highlight of their season was the T20 competition where unfortunately they lost their last game and missed out on the final due to their lower net run rate. In the One Day competition the team only recorded two wins finishing in seventh place. In the Two Day competition the team also finished 7th.

My usual end of season 'gripe' . . . the whole promotion relegation system continues to be a 'bone of contention' for our club. As a 'Premier Club' our club continues to be at a disadvantage to other clubs by having our 2nd team in Div 1 although it is interesting to note that now three Premier clubs will have their 2nd team in Div 1. I also sadly note that Riccarton, a long-standing Premier club with over a hundred years of history, have been relegated from the Premier grade. I fail to see how this system promotes club cricket to be strong in Christchurch. From our club point of view, it is more difficult to attract and retain new young players to the club and the lower standard of Div 1 does not help prepare our younger players for Prems. The continual focus on promotion/relegation is a constant distraction and lessens the enjoyment of playing cricket. This said, going forward the onus is on our club to be better and in particular earn promotion for our Div 1 side into the Championship Grade.

As in previous years lower grade teams were mostly 'closed teams' with the captains selecting the teams under the ever-watchful and perceptive eye of Donn Leckie. Donn puts in a huge amount of time and effort in organising and monitoring these teams. Once again, Donn deserves a BIG THANK YOU for all the work he does. He continues to play a key role for the club.

Coaching

Coaching at the senior level of the club was focussed around the Premier/2A squad. Pre-season training was held at the indoor nets at the Sir Richard Hadlee Sports Centre in Hagley Park and were well attended. It is awesome to have such a fantastic cricket facility in Christchurch. During the season the squad trained Tuesday and Thursday nights at Burwood. We continue to have good practice facilities and the players continue to work hard at improving their skill set.

Junior coaching was organised by Paul Cottam and the junior committee. This is largely based around parents coaching the team that their son/daughter play in. Paul and the junior committee do an excellent job in ensuring each junior team has a coach and a time to practice.

As in previous seasons the East Shirley Cricket Club continued the Coach Mentoring, Support and Development programme in conjunction with Christchurch Metro Cricket and NZ Cricket. As in previous years all coaches at the club were required to register and complete several online coaching modules and 2 practical sessions at either the Foundation or the Advanced Foundation level. This scheme is designed to improve the standard of coaching and is generally working well. Pleasing, a good number of our junior coaches had completed the programme by the end of the season. Well done to these coaches. Thanks to Paul Cottam and the junior committee for their help in implementing this programme.

Congratulations to our Canterbury Representatives Ken McClure and Leo Carter. Congratulations also to Regan Sheahan who was selected to play for Canterbury 'A'. It continues to be a pleasure to have these guys playing at the club. The other squad members really appreciate the commitment and loyalty these guys show to the club despite their busy playing commitments.

PREMIERSHIP GRADE

The Prems team looked a well-balanced team as we headed into the new season. Our pace bowling looked strong with Nathan McNicol, Jared Roberts, and Tom Gooday expected to return from injury. Our spin attack with Regan Sheahan and Matt Munro, while relatively young, gave us both a left arm and a right arm spinner. All rounders, Ben Hanham and Brad Entwistle covered the medium pace roles. Our batting also looked good with a mixture of experience and youth. Mitch McMillan had the keeping spot covered and also strengthened our batting. So, overall the team was feeling positive about our season prospects and looking for an improved performance on the previous season. This was achieved to a large extent as the team played consistently better than last season even though our final placings and results didn't show it.

The team finished 5th in the Two-day competition with one outright win and four draws in seven games. Three of these games were rained off on the second day when we were in potentially winnable positions. We also lost outright to Heathcote in a close fought game in which we had our chances to win. The highlight of the Two Day season was our exciting outright win against Old Boys with Regan Sheahan capturing the final Old Boys wicket in the last over of the game. So, while finishing 5th overall seems a little disappointing, the team felt we had played better than that and probably deserved a higher placing.

In the One Day competition the team also finished 5th with three wins from seven games in what was a very even competition. We had wins over St Albans, Lancaster Park and Old Boys. Heading into the last round five teams were fighting it out for the final two semi-finals spots and despite us winning other results did not go our way and we finished 5th. A frustrating loss to Riccarton after posting a very competitive score effectively cost us a place in the semi-finals. The highlight of the One Day competition was the outstanding win over Old Boys [again] where we chased down 275 with 2 overs to go and only 4 wickets down. An outstanding 115 by Landon Neal led the way in this game.

In the T20 competition the team struggled somewhat with only two wins over St Albans and Burnside West. Although a third win would have placed us 4th equal in another tightly fought competition. Most of our players are not naturally suited to the high-risk nature of T20 cricket at the moment and we have to make improvements or changes to be better. Our best win was the victory over BWU at Burwood Park on a Thursday evening in front of a good crowd. We bowled and fielded exceptionally well to restrict BWU to 106 and then chased the runs down with 2 overs to go.

One major issue for the team this season was the loss of keeper Mitch McMillan to injury halfway through the season. However, Myran Moore stepped up from Div 1 and proved very capable with the gloves over the latter half of the season. He also scored some useful runs for us at times.

Standout performers for the season were Regan Sheahan, who had his best Premier season to date, and Jed Roberts. Regan was superb with the bat scoring 705 runs for the season at an average of 32 as well as taking 24 wickets with the ball. Jed Roberts was also superb capturing 43 wickets at an impressive average of 15.49, backing up from last season where he also took over 40 wickets. Both Regan and Jed were named in the 'Premier Men's Team of the Year' by Christchurch Metro in recognition of their performances. Other batsman to have impressive seasons were Landon Neal who played outstandingly in the One Dayers averaging over 50 [as did Regan] and was also our equal leading runs scorer in the T20 competition. Captain Tim Hampton-Matehe also had another strong season scoring 578 runs. Ken McClure and Leo

Carter both made the most of their limited appearances averaging 41 and 42 respectively. Ben Hanham, in his last season, made a useful all round contribution being our third highest wicket taker and averaging over 18 with the bat [plus 11 catches]. Brad Entwistle had his best Premier season to date scoring over 400 runs at an average of around 20. Nathan McNicol also featured with the ball taking 29 wickets including one 6 wicket bag. Jared 'Dutchie' Van Eyk Menkman also deserves a mention for his impressive bowling in capturing 22 wickets. Dutchie began the season in Div 1 but played most of the season in Prems as our third seamer with the highlight being his 4/11 in the last game.

Congratulations to Caleb Donaldson who played his first game of Prems for East this season. We look forward to seeing more of Caleb.

Finally, thanks to all the players who have played for Prems this season. It was another long season and your efforts are valued. Thanks also to our friends and family supporters who regularly come down to watch us play, your support is appreciated. Thank you also to a number of Player Sponsors who supported the club. Hopefully, everyone had an enjoyable season and are looking forward to next season.

While some of us cricket nuffies were having nets throughout the winter, an off-season football injury to our incumbent Captain Blair Harkerss, and serious injury late in the previous season to Tim Williams left a big hole in our bowling, middle order, and fielding capabilities. Meanwhile, four players in our squad played in representative teams during the season, and some other more regular players were unable to commit as much time as previous years. This left us in a bit of hole at times that saw us lean on plenty of ring-ins, young and old, as well as playing short on more than one occasion. Unfortunately, we even had to default one game but we did manage to lend players to our Div. One side to help them out in the process. All up we've recorded 31 names in the scorebook for our 16 matches.

An assessment of the season matches would report that we started off on the back foot after disappointing defeats to Sydenham Hospital and both Burnside sides, before getting things back on track with three good wins against the East Shirley Strikers, Old Boys, and Lancaster Park. But another discouraging loss before Christmas to Ohoka knocked us back to earth. Post break our hopes of a top six finish were raised with wins over the Sydenham Cardinals and Merivale-Papanui, but then a lack of players saw us default to Burnside Robbie's and then losses to the two top sides sealed our fate to the bottom seven. Our loss to Sumner was heavy and hurt a little, but we held our heads high with a fighting loss to grade winners Saint Albans, where we made them fight long and hard to seal the title at Burwood Park.

In terms of individual bowling performances, Rob Leys and Tim Grocott took the new ball most of the time, and their experience and consistency saw them claim the bulk of the wickets for the side. Rob with 16, and Tim with 15. Close behind was Gareth Sanders, and his return of 13 wickets at 19.3 average is impressive when considering he was often bowling through injury. Tom Music bowled more overs of off spin than we all would have expected and gave good account with 9 wickets including 4/41 v Ohoka. The group of slow bowlers: Richard Papps, Tony Gray, and Matt Fleming were always reliable, once they made it onto the park. Tony Gray was seen more often at the after-match than on the field. He did however pick up the best bowling figures of the year with 4/34 in the last match v Strikers, pipping Richard Papps' excellent 4/35 v Cardinals. Surprisingly, Blair Harkerss was back at the bowling crease late in the season and still hitting the same excellent zones as usual with increasing pace as time went on.

Leading total runs with the bat was Murray Seaton, 556, including team best 129no v East Shirley Strikers and 102no v Lancaster Park. Following up was Tom Music 396, Karl Smith 386, and Jase Riach 265 (from 7 innings). Mitch Petheram added valuable middle order runs until tearing his bicep off, Gareth Sanders put in a nice 69 at Burnside, and Paul Cottam batted 5 times to score 26 runs without being dismissed, including 16no vs Cardinals at South New Brighton Domain. Standout batting performances also include an unbeaten opening stand of 170 from Tom Music (70no) and Jase Riach (76no) to beat the East Shirley Strikers by a satisfying 10 wickets and get our season on track back in the early rounds.

Despite squad shortages and on-field ups and downs it was another enjoyable season. Thank you to the work put in by Ann McLeod with our scoring, and to Claw (Steve Sharman) with his

exceptional work on the chilly bin. Likewise, club admin and grounds staff make this possible, especially Donn Leckie, and we appreciate the time that everyone puts in to allow us to get out into the nets most Wednesdays and onto the park every Saturday afternoon.

JUNIOR REPORT

Once again we have been fortunate to have an excellent junior committee which made the job of convenor very manageable and enjoyable. A committee of eight divvied up responsibilities very well and pulled together for a well-run season, culminating in a well-attended end of season prize giving in March. Team evenings were also held each side of Christmas for all teams.

These results of course could not happen without all the junior coaches and the helpers within their teams, so a massive thanks to them for what certainly appeared to me to an enjoyable season for the children which is of course what it's all about.

Generous sponsor support was received from: Better Choice Home Loans; Accessman; Des Haines' Southern Business Machines; Heroes Burgers; Foodstuffs; and Parklands Subway.

We had 150 juniors across sixteen teams which, although down by ten percent from the season before for unknown reasons, was still good numbers for a viable junior section across all the grades. A highlight was again working with Cat Quinn from Southern Districts (and CJCA staffer) to form a combined Year 7 and 8 girls' team with them, called South East Otautahi. This is an important step for encouraging and supporting girls' cricket for both our club and in Eastern Christchurch. Cat is keen to coach the team again with most of the same players, and to keep developing girls' teams in other grades under the South East Otautahi banner.

One of the strengths of our club is the parent-driven coaching of our junior teams, with many finding that they are able to perform this role whatever their sporting background may have been. New coaches, and assistant coaches stepping up, included Paul Milligan and Nick Downes, with Keith Taylor and Patrick Broughton returning to co-coach a team. Special thanks to Kere Reihana for coaching a team where there was a gap, and to those parents who supported the coaches in the running of the teams.

Karen O'Donovan again did an outstanding job of running the administration and registration process well, Ann McLeod took care of uniforms, Angus McLeod oversaw the gear, with Tracey Painter helping out with events and activities. Other members of the committee were of course coaches, Scott Bennett, Phil Black and Ross Martin. Our main fundraising activity was the Naked Baker pies, this time the 'four pack' option, which proved to be popular and successful.

The continuing highlight this season were games being played on the John Grocott Oval, the junior artificial pitch on the old bowling club at Burwood Park. Although it took some monitoring of the draw and accounting for weather, all of our hardball teams played there during the season. The outfield stood up over the season, aided by some judicious watering over Waitangi weekend. We've gone from having no hardball games at Burwood to having two every Saturday, a terrific result.

There's still more work to do on the Oval outfield, which will be an ongoing focus. The committee carried out some outfield remediation at the end of the season and will look to do more next season. We'll also need to keep lobbying the Council for an irrigation extension into the JGO outfield for a long-term solution. On the other side of the park, the new run-ups at the lower field artificial nets have ensured that they are well used by junior teams for training. An ongoing focus will be on replacing the worn surface inside the nets.

We had 16 juniors take part in the spring and/or summer CJCA festival games and tournaments. Those who played in the South Island Primary Schools tournament were Logan McLachlan, Jacob Page, Daniel Jervis, Riley Jones, Zac Chalmers and Oscar van Onselen. These players also took part in the Year 8 festival games, as did Mason McLachlan. The Year 7 festival players were Flynn Bennett, Asher Hollis, Levi Hagger, Quade Dyer, Rylan O'Donovan, Sam Costello, Charlie Mahendran and Jack Straker. Oscar Black was Year 6's Festival player. Plus of course thanks to the big effort their Easts coaches put in supporting them at the tournaments.

Look forward to seeing everyone again next season (we've already started planning for it!) to keep building on some great momentum.

TREASURER'S REPORT

The financial results this year can best be described as "satisfactory" - with the caveat that as we remain overly dependent on funding sources beyond our control (grants and donations) it would not take much to tip us into an "unsatisfactory" situation.

On the one hand, the small surplus before depreciation of \$2,053 (last year \$3,949) could be viewed as a good result given the testing financial environment over the last 12 months. Credit is due to the Committee who have attempted to keep expenses aligned to and within the budgeted revenue sources. Even so, we were only "saved" from recording a loss thanks to the unexpected generous bequest of \$5,000 from the estate of the late Trevor Hayes along with some late sponsorship funding.

On the other hand, and looking forward, the over reliance on external funding (grants, donations and sponsorships) places us in a financial position over which we have limited control. Our expenses are already confined to the essentials and do not vary greatly from season to season – and the variations that are observed tend to be for gear and uniforms which may change each year but which are largely met by grant funding, so have minimal impact on the bottom line. As has been noted in past Treasurer's reports, we need to generate more revenue through our own efforts: more fund-raising and actively seeking sponsorship support are obvious candidates. But this requires the joint efforts of all members, seniors and juniors, and not just the small group that currently shoulder this burden. The Junior Section has shown the way in recent years but if we are to put our Club finances on a more sustainable future path, then this will involve effort and commitment from all members.

Looking at the accounts this year, revenue rose by \$13,450 which was more than matched by the rise in expenses of \$15,846, resulting in a loss of \$2,200 (last year a loss of \$696). The revenue rise was largely due to the bequest (noted above), increased subscriptions and a lift in grants from charitable trusts, which continue to be a mainstay of our income.

Expenses changes were:

- Administration costs up by approx. \$3,500, largely due to the employment of Simply Admin (Julie Briggs) to manage our day-to-day finances and communications (refer below).
- Coaching and scoring up by approx. \$6,500. The annual comparison is not quite valid, as the latest year includes overdue reimbursement to our scorer who had not been reimbursed for the last three seasons.
- Cricket equipment down approx. \$6,000. This item can fluctuate year on year depending on team numbers and the extent to which existing stocks can meet demand or need to be topped up.
- Grounds up approx. \$4,000. In the latest year, new pitch covers were purchased.
- Uniforms up approx. \$8,000. The costs of the playing uniforms were largely met by targeted grants and/or player reimbursements.

The statement of financial position clearly sets out the situation at balance date. The liquidity position is fairly sound with funds in the bank exceeding our current liabilities. Our equity is down reflecting the small loss, and we need to reverse this and move into a surplus situation. Losses, however small, are not sustainable in the long run, especially as we know we are facing increased costs. We also have the added pressure of needing to undertake a major renovation of the Burwood number one pitch which is tired and showing its age. This renovation, possibly costing up to \$40,000, has now been deferred for two seasons.

The Management Committee engaged Community Capacity Accounting to audit the financial accounts which had not been audited for a number of years. On 24 August 2023 they completed the audit of the accounts for the financial years 2020, 2021 and 2022. The comparative 2022 figures contained in this Annual Report are the audited figures. The audits did not lead to any material changes to the accounts previously published. At the time of printing this Annual Report the financial accounts for 2023 have not been audited.

In conclusion, thanks are due to the key agencies and individuals without whose support we would struggle to provide the top facilities and grounds we believe our members deserve, if they are to have an enjoyable cricket experience. While many of these are acknowledged elsewhere in the report, our thanks to:

- The charitable gaming trusts and Christchurch Metropolitan Cricket Assn.
- Our many sponsors, especially the key ones: Baileys Real Estate, Better Choice Home Loans and Accessman.
- Alan Stroud of O'Sheas and Gareth Greenfield of Cricket Express who support the Club in a number of different ways.
- Those past and present club members who have generously made donations to the Club.

Managing the club's finances:

In mid-2022, Josh Milne advised the Management Committee that he would be standing down as Treasurer, following the preparation of the 2021/22 financial accounts. At the 2022 AGM, the vacant Treasurer position could not be filled. Subsequently, Myran Moore informed the Committee that he was willing to take up the position and he was appointed Treasurer at the Management Committee Meeting of 31 October 2022.

Earlier, in August 2022, the Committee had engaged Simply Admin (Julie Briggs) on contract to manage both the day-to-day finances of the Club and our communications with members (website, Facebook and email contacts). Julie's contract relieved the Treasurer of the daily tasks associated with the management and reporting of our finances, and he was able to focus more on providing oversight and guidance. He continued to do so, even though located overseas at the end of the season. The Management Committee continues to have overall responsibility for budgeting and expenditure approvals. This arrangement has worked well and Julie's contract has been renewed for a further twelve months.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MAY 2023

1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Reporting Entity

East Christchurch Shirley Cricket Club (Inc) is incorporated under the Incorporated Societies Act 1908.

Basis of Preparation

The financial reports of the East Christchurch Shirley Cricket Club (Inc) are special purpose reports prepared for the Club Management Committee and Club members.

Measurement Base

The accounting principles recognised as appropriate for the measurement and reporting of financial performance on a historical cost basis have been followed by the Club. Reliance is placed upon the fact that the Club is a going concern and that accrual accounting is used to match expenses and revenues.

Specific Accounting Policies

The following is a summary of the significant accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements.

(a) Accounts Receivable

Accounts receivable are stated at their estimated net realisable value.

(b) Inventories

Inventories are valued at the lower of cost or net realisable value, on a first-in-first-out basis.

(c) Fixed Assets

Fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation except for plaving dear which is stated at valuation. Buildings have not been revalued to the registered market valuation. Depreciation is calculated using rates considered appropriate by the Committee.

(d) Goods and Services Tax

The financial statements have been prepared on a GST exclusive basis.

(e) Liabilities

Liabilities are stated at the estimated amounts payable and include obligations which can be reliably estimated.

(f) Grants and Donations

Grant and donation income is recognised as income on receipt unless the Society has a liability to repay if the requirements of the grant or donation are not fulfilled. A liability is recognised to the extent that such conditions are unfulfilled at the end of the reporting period.

Changes in Accounting Policies

There have been no material changes in accounting policies. All policies have been applied on a basis consistent with those used in the previous year.

8. **PAVILION REDEVELOPMENT & SHIRLEY SPORTS CLUB LIMITED**

The Club entered into a Heads of Agreement and Joint Venture Agreement with the Shirley Rugby Football Club Inc. for the redevelopment of the existing pavilion in 2004. The project commenced in March 2005 and was completed in November 2005. Under the agreement, the pavilion is managed by the Shirley Sports Club Limited, a non-profit company established for this purpose. Each Club has equal shareholding and appoints three Directors. Under the agreement, "ownership" of the pavilion passed to the company at an agreed value and a notional gain on sale resulted. This was treated as an increase in member's funds in the 2006 year. During the 2015 year a further advance of \$5,000 was made and, by agreement, rent owing totalling \$27,000, net of GST, was deducted from the advance. As a result, the amount of the advance to the company was reduced. There have been no transactions of similar nature in subsequent financial years. At balance date advances made by the Club to Shirley Sports Club Limited totalled \$254,660 (last year \$254,660). The advance is interest free and repayable on demand.

In addition, in 2023 \$3,200 (\$Nil in 2022) was received by the Club from the ANZ Cricket Grant Scheme, by which a grant of \$80 is paid towards Junior subscriptions, per qualifying Junior player. The amount is included in Subscriptions income (\$30,860).

10. INCOME TAX

The Society does not pay income tax under CW46 of the Income Tax Act 2007.

11. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

The Society has related party transactions with the Shirley Sports Club Limited. In the current year the club was charged rent of \$10,000 (2022: \$10,000). This reflects the current arrangement whereby rents are determined by the directors in consultation with member clubs based on funds required to manage the company effectively. The current basis was introduced from the year commencing 1 April 2015.

During the year under review, East Christchurch Shirley Cricket Club Inc. has transactions with committee members of the Society for expenditures incurred on behalf of East Christchurch Shirley Cricket Club Inc. These transactions were on a normal commercial basis.

President Tim Grocott and contracted club coach, David Grocott are related. During the year, David Grocott was paid \$13,867 for coaching services in accordance with the contract. (2022: \$11,975).

12. CAPITAL COMMITMENTS

The Club had no capital commitments as at 31 May 2023. (2022: \$Nil)

13. CONTINGENT LIABILITIES

The Club had no contingent liabilities as at 31 May 2023. (2022: \$Nil)

14. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

There are no events subsequent to balance date which would materially affect the Financial Statements as at 31 May 2023 (2022 \$Nil).

15. AUDITED ACCOUNTS

The last year the financial accounts of the Club were audited was for the year ending 31 May 2019. The Committee engaged Community Capacity Accounting to audit the accounts for the 31 May Years 2020, 2021 and 2022 and the audits were completed on 24 August 2023. The audits did not identify any matters that would materially affect the Financial Statements. The comparative figures for the year ending 31 May 2022 contained in these Financial Statements are the audited figures. The Auditor's Report for the 31 May Year 2022 Financial Statements is included in this Annual Report with the current year's accounts for reference.

As a result of the audit, the 2022 figures show minor differences compared to the unaudited accounts previously published. For example:

AUDITOR'S REPORT

Opinion (Qualified)

I have audited the financial statements of **East Christchurch Shirley Cricket Club Incorporated**, an Incorporated Society, for the year ended 31 May 2022. These statements include the Statement of Financial Performance, Statement of Financial Position and Statement of Accounting Policies and the Notes.

I could not obtain sufficient evidence to verify that all subscriptions and fundraising income is stated completely and accurately in the Financial Statements. This is due to such income being received in cash, and the absence of relevant controls and records that would limit the risk of such cash being misappropriated. With the exception of this limitation, in my opinion, the Performance Report provide a true and fair view of the financial activities of East Christchurch Shirley Cricket Club Incorporated for the year ended 31 May 2022 and their financial position at that date in accordance with their accounting policies. The organisation is not subject to the New Zealand Financial Reporting Framework.

Basis for Opinion

I have taken guidance from New Zealand auditing standards ISA(NZ) in performing this audit in as much as they are applicable to small not-for-profit entities, and also considering the readability of this report for non-accountants.

An audit involves collecting and examining evidence about the numbers and other information presented in the financial statements. The auditor is striving for a very high degree of accuracy and therefore assurance. This also means that the information given in the statements must be *complete*, with no significant omissions that may mislead the reader of the Statements.

Audit procedures for an entity such as this may involve:

- Gathering evidence that both income and expenses include all transactions that relate to the reporting period (not just those paid within that period). Such evidence may include the organisation's internal processes and analysis of the organisation's transaction patterns.
